85 At Blessing For Expectant Mothers

More than 85 expectant mothers presented themselves at St. Joseph's Church, Rochester, on Thursday, Feb. 22, for the first public ceremony of the Church Blessing for Expectant Mothers and consecration of the coming child to Our Blessed Mother. The Blessing has the approval of His Excellency, Bishop Keane.

These sincere Christian mothers were given an eloquent and inspiring address by the Rev. Michael J. Kleeman, C.S.B., who conducted the impressive ceremony.

Those witnessing this unique ceremony, expressed the belief that if it could be most widespread neither the church nor nation would have to fear the destructive doctrine of pagan birth control.

So inspired and grateful were the young expectant mothers that it was decided to have the blessing each month and to make arrangements to be necessary in funeral services.

Everyone who knows the great joy when looking into the eyes of an innocent babe, can in a measure realize the joy that is a mother's who has been privileged by God to cooperate with Him in giving life to her child and the greatest of all joys when the soul of that child has been regenerated in the Water of Baptism, made a child of God and heir of heaven.

"The Mother of today must not be satisfied to have her children live according to the letter of the law but must teach them to live by the Spirit of Christ, a life of Love. She must by her example inspire them to begin to live the life here that will continue in Eternity."

Father Kleeman explained and imparted the Blessing solemnly consecrating the coming child to the Blessed Mother and closed the ceremony with a prayer of Thanksgiving.

Dates of future Blessings will appear in the CATHOLIC COURIER. It is announced by Mrs. Lawrence A. Weider, who directed arrangements for the first public ceremony.
