Tenebrae's Meaning

Tenebrae is the public chanting of a part of the Divine Office, taking place on Wednesday, Thursday and Friday of Holy Week.

The service takes its name Tenebrae (darkness) from a symbolic ceremony, the gradual extinguishing of candles until only one remains lighted; this is hidden for a time behind the altar, and is then brought forth, a symbol of the Resurrection. The candles number 15. One is extinguished at the end of each of 14 palms of the Office, and one remains lighted.
