When I had put the last bit of bandage in place, one soldier began to furnible at the pocket of his uniform, trying to unbutton it. I could not imagine what he wanted to \$50, so I waited patiently. Finally he got the pocket open and carefully extracted from it what seemed to be his most prized possession. With a very solemen air he offered it to me. It was his last cigarette!"
