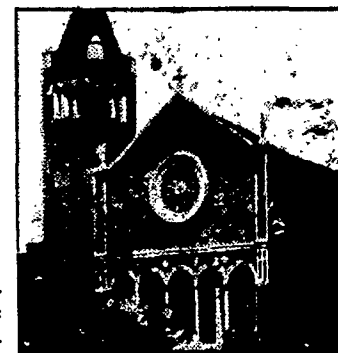

Story of Passion Told By Bishop In Radio Discourse

The victory of Jesus Christ was the victory of faith over doubt. His Excellency, Bishop Kearney declared in a radio address over Station WHAM Monday in connection with America's Passion Play, "Veronica's Veil" opening here Friday.

In a scholarly discourse on the meaning of the Passiontide and its significance to the human soul, the Bishop said: "This is the story of Passiontide—the age old tale that the Passion Play will revive in our memories with that deep reverence which characterized their efforts last Passiontide. They come to us not as paid players, actors and actresses, but as organized propagandists, with a sincere group of Christian gentlemen and gentlewomen who 'Love to tell the story How once the King of Glory Came down on earth to dwell.'"

PAPAL OFFICIAL IS FAMILIAR FIGURE AT ROME 'STATIONS'

One of the most faithful in attendance at the "Stations" in Rome—that historic ceremony for which the laity gather at a different church in the Eternal City every day of Lent—is Monsignor Carlo Resplighi, first Papal Master of Ceremonies. Monsignor Resplighi is to be seen every day, both morning and afternoon, at the Station Church (the church designated for that day's ceremony) helping in the preparation of things, assisting in the ceremonies, and actively leading in the singing and in the recitation of the litanies.
