Beautiful city is built had belonged for many years to the Catholic... Father Bulard, O.M.I. of Northern Canada had a very terrible experience recently.

The properly rights of these lands had passed to their descendants and heirs, especially to Daniel Carroll of Duddington and to Noley Young, who in his second marriage wedded the sister of Archbishop Carroll, and it was to them that the first President turned on March 20, 1791, for the cession of the ground.

Among the many who vied for the honor of assisting in the work of building and beautifying the seat of Government from its first foundation, we find other illustrious Catholics: the architect James Hoban, designer of the White House, who also worked on the Hall of Congress, was one of the founders of St. Patrick's; Giuseppe Franzoni, relative of Canova, adorned the Capitol; James Barry in 1806 provided at his own expense for the construction of the first Chapel, St. Mary's, which no longer exists.

In a city such as this, built in an historically Catholic environment, with the marked cooperation of influential Catholics, we are not surprised to know that its first Mayor was Judge Brent of Virginia, the nephew of Archbishop Carroll; and that Daniel Carroll of Duddington, famous for his generous gifts to the Church, gave a plot of ground called "Cathedral Square" with the thought that his relative, Archbishop Carroll, would later transfer his episcopal city to the seat of the Government.

"On that tract of ground there now rises the church of St. Vincent de Paul with the neighboring houses. But in the plaza of Divine Providence Baltimore was to be and to remain the Jerusalem of the Church in America, and from it was to begin the marvelous development of one hundred sixteen dioceses now existing in the United States.

"Today the Cathedral Church of Baltimore, deservedly elevated to the rank of basilica as the most venerable church of Rome, has produced and gathered a choicer and precious fruit, the Archdiocese of Washington, and keeps it united to itself under the direct successor of John Carroll, whose outstanding characteristics were that of founder of the American Hierarchy and great patriot.

"As first Bishop of the American Confederation he began his episcopal ministry in the same year in which the Constitution went into force the year in which George Washington, his personal friend, was proclaimed President of the new republic.

"Just as the memory returns to-day spontaneously in dutiful recollection of the well-deserving personages intimately associated in the birth and construction of this capital city, so with the same spontaneity there bursts forth in the hearts of the Catholics of America a profound exaltation for today's historic happenings."
