NEW YORK INC. A Catholic population of 21403,136 for the United States, Assica and the Ha-waiian Islands is reported in "The Official Catholic Directsory for 1940," just issued by P. J. Kenedy Upholstery - Repairing - Cleaning & Sons, New York.


