St. Francis' Recreation Center Campaign Opens

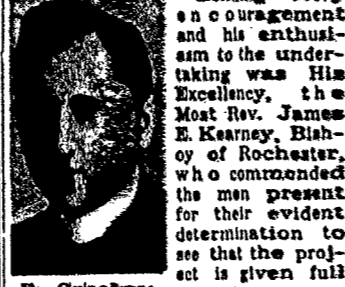
