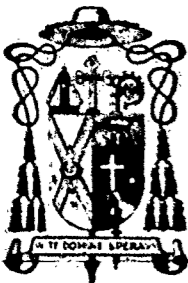

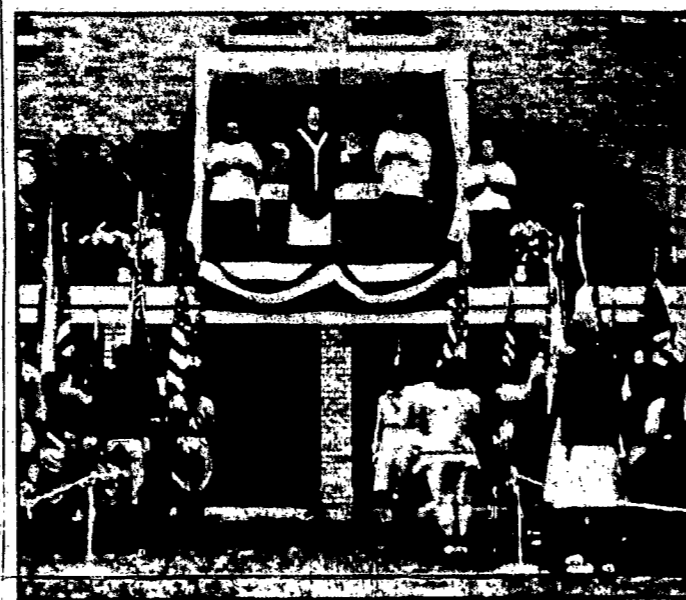
With the victim on a stretcher, Father Henry rode to the County Hospital in the patrol wagon voling words of consolation to the stricken man.

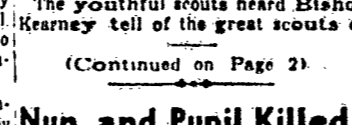
