

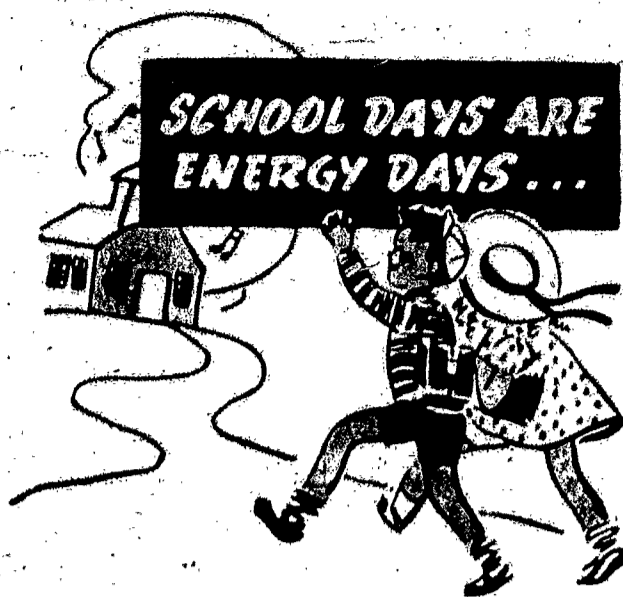

### Legion of Mary Active Here

The Church of the Legion of Mary met in St. Monica's Hall, Thursday, May 9, with the officers and spiritual directors of three Praesidia present.

Reports of Legion activity in the diocese included the promotion of parish societies, the distribution of Catholic literature, the recruiting of public school children for religious instruction, the increasing of Auxiliary membership, and the extension of the Legion into other parishes.

Miss Mary Duffy of Dublin, Ireland, who for several years has been organizing the Legion in the United States and Canada, addressed the group, emphasizing the urgent need for the zealous and persevering service which the Legion, uniquely, is capable of and is rendering throughout the world today.

The Actes, annual ceremony of consecration to the Blessed Mother of Mary to the Blessed Mother was held at Sacred Heart Pro-Cathedral on Sunday afternoon, May 5. Active and Auxiliary members attended.

The ceremony was opened by the Rt. Rev. Msgr. George V. Burns, diocesan director of the Legion. The Rev. Joseph V. Curton of St. John the Evangelist Church, Clyde, delivered an address on the Legion of Mary as Catholic Action.

Consecration of Consecratories to Our Lady was made in the presence of the diocesan director, the Active members reciting the words of consecration at the altar in groups of five and the Auxiliary members reciting the words of consecration in a body. A spiritual bouquet was given by every Legionary.

The ceremony closed with Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament.
