

Holy Cross College Given Large Bequest

WORCESTER, Mass.—Holy Cross College is to receive 20 percent of the residue of the estimated \$2,000,000 estate of Mrs. Mary (Griffin) Ellis, widow of Theodore T. Ellis, newspaper publisher and manufacturer, whose will was filed for probate yesterday. Mrs. Ellis' funeral was held Thursday with a Solemn Mass in the Church of the Blessed Sacrament.

"The Madonna and Child," one of the world's most famous paintings, attributed to Raphael, is bequeathed to the Worcester Art Museum, together with all the other paintings and art works owned by the Ellis.

The monetary value of the collection has been reported as more than \$400,000. The "Madonna and Child" alone is estimated to have a value of \$300,000.

The bequest to Holy Cross College stipulates that the principal be kept intact and the income used for scholarship purposes for worthy Worcester students.


