

NAZARETH TO BUILD IN PITTSFORD Bishop Kearney

Ground To Be Broken July 5

Bishop Kearney Will Officiate

At the Commencement Exercises of Nazareth College on Wednesday, Bishop James E Kear ney, D'D Chancellor of the College announced an immediate building plan, changed somewhat from the plan previously considered by the Sisters of St. Joseph in regard to the site of the new College Instead of establishing the new brailding, and therefore the College of the future, on the present site, be-tween Augustine Street and Seneca Parkway, it has been decaded to locate the College for the women of the Diocono of Romester near the Motherhouse, which was built and opened twelve years ago as the main center of the Sister hood of the St. Joseph in this Di-

The present building program will be limited to the school unsit, a gymnasium which will serve also as an auditorium, and provision will be made for residence students. The large chapel of the Mot her-house will accommodate the students, and the present power-house will also serve the new buildings. Original Plans Recalled

When the Motherhouse was built twelve years ago, it was at Birst intended to serve the students of the new College as well as the Sisters, and also as the Normal School for the young Sisters. It was soon found, however, that this Fr. Schwab Named Pastor composite plan was not feasible. as the College and the Normal School Of New Elmira Parish be placed in the same building. ac-cording to the New York Siate Law, nor could the two be accommodal. ed in the building Hence the College, having outgrown the Glass House and its annex on lake Avenue, found more roomly quarters in the previous Normal School building on Augustine Street, after the new home in Pittsford.

The present Augustine Street buildings have long been incadequate for the best interests of the College, and much thought has been given to the selection of a location which would best serve the interests of the College For the last few years it has seemed best to build the first unit of the time Street site, since the debt to be assumed would be great even for the erection of one unit, and present College buildings could still serve for residence, caleteria. library and chapel. The final change of the plan for the placing, and building of the College comes now as something of a surprise to thre friends of the College.

Nazareth Academy, founded in 1871, is under the special and direct patronage of the Mon. Rev. James E. Kearney, D.D., Bishop of the Diocese of Rochester.
Chartered under the Regents of the University of the State of New York, it is registered as a school of secondary education with all the powers, privileges and duties and subject to all lignitations and restrictions pre-scribed for such institutions by law or by university ordinances.

The first Nagareth Academy was located in a wing of the Mother House of the Sisters of St. Joseph on Jay Street. Its first graduation class consisted of one member. Miss Jane M. Leazy came the Assistant Superior of the Community.

Consistent growth in enrollment and courses of study of-fered made it necessary to expand the quarters of the Academy and in September, 1916, school opened in the new build-ing on Lake Avenue which seemed apacious enough to am-swer all possible demands of imcreased registration and a chang-ing curriculum.
