Declaration of Independence

The Declaration of Independence was adopted by the Continental Congress at Philadelphia, on July 4, 1776, and signed by John Hancock as President, and by Charles Thompson as Secretary. It was published first on July 6 in the Pennsylvania Evening Post. A copy of the Declaration, engrossed on parchment, was signed by members of Congress and after Aug. 2, 1776, Presarable.

The 'Bill of Rights'

ARTICLE I
Religious Establishment Prohibited
Freedom of Speech, of the Press, and Right of Petition
Congress shall make no law respecting an establishment of religion, or prohibiting the free exercise thereof; or abridging the freedom of speech or of the press; or the right of the people peaceably to assemble and to petition the Government for a redress of grievances.
