THE NEGRO PROBLEM

COURIER'S CURRENT INEMA COMMENTS

"All This and Heaven Too" (CB)
In all with the film "versions of heart selling books comes "All This and Heaven Too," a dramatization of the Rachel Field novel. The picture follows the book carefully, attempting only the experiences of Henriette Delany-DePavia, a French governess, heroine of the story, after she had become Mrs. Henry Field.

As filmed, it is a frequently absorbing picture, even though it seems less than compelling. You watch the unhappy experiences of Henriette with complete attention but with a curious detachment. Little sympathy can be worked up for any of the main characters, even though they are all well played. This applies particularly to the character of the Disciple in Paris, the role played by Charles Hays. He is an accomplished actor and he plays with his usual finesse, but one cannot condone the behavior of the character no matter what the motivation is. As his wife, the pitiful, sheering actress, Doro Merande, does not do well, she dominates her scenes by her intensity of portrayal.

"South of Pago Pago" (Not Classified)
You would think by the title that the movie would have exhausted their supply of South Sea islands. They've been at it ever since "White Shadows in the South Seas" many years ago—and there's a whole lot more in "South of Pago Pago." It's the old story of a group of wicked white men who turn a tropical paradise into a white man's hellhole. Neither the story nor the characters are very believable and much of it is overdone.

"The Captain Is a Lady" (A-1)
When you think of Bette Davis you think of the screen's most distinguished character actress. When you think of Charles Coburn, you think of a man who has done many fine things in the theater and screen. When you think of Virginia Grey, you think of youthful beauty and when the names of Helen Broderick, Billie Burke, Helen Westley and Marjorie Main occur to you, you remember some excellent supporting jobs. With a lineup of plays like that, you would think that a picture would be an outstanding one. That's what we thought too. "The Captain Is a Lady," though, is disappointing—a very weak and old-fashioned play, with only the efforts of the excellent cast making it acceptable entertainment—and no more.

"Cross Country Romance" is Carbon Copy Number 1. Can't Court That High of "It Happened One Night." But it's a bright enough carbon with Wanda Barrie still one of the more sprightly ingenues and Gene Raymond, minus the platinum locks, doing all right in his comeback.

Then there is "You're Not So Tough" in which you see the Orlin as interpreted by the Dead End Kids. It seems unnecessary to mention that the picture is hardly an item of social significance. Billy Hatcher continues to show being serious, but the best thing about the picture is the moving performance of Rosina Gall.

"The most critical period in our national existence having ended in the adoption of the new Constitution," Monsignor Artigas said, "it behooves us to render thanksgiving to Almighty God. 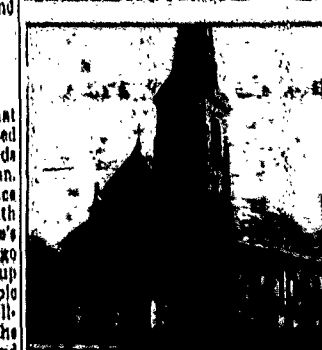

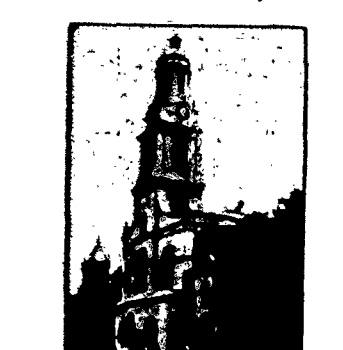
