The past week has brought sorrow to Rochester and to neighboring cities in the list of young people who have died in accidents.

Some at the beaches, some on the roads, some in the fields, have been called by death.

The COURIER extends its sympathy to the families of these young people in their hour of trial.

Accidents will happen, even with all the care we give to their prevention.

Rochester has been rejoicing in the passing of 71 days without a single fatality.

That rejoicing is now at an end. But the list of the dead of the past week should move every citizen in all of our communities to greater caution and care for accident prevention.

Some pointers may help us in this Safety Drive. Why not confine our swimming, where possible, to points where the water is not over our heads?

Five feet of water will give us every advantage that thirty feet will give, and will carry with it a guaranty of safety.

Why not walk out and swim in? Far better than swimming out, only to find ourselves beyond our depth when it is too late.

In driving, why not stay well within the speed laws? Why not let caution be our constant rule?

When glaring lights blind us, why not come to a stop instead of plowing through streets where there are children about?

Why not feel our way carefully, especially when parked cars or other things shut off our vision?

In thunderstorms, why not seek a safe spot away from trees or high poles? In walking, why not be constantly alert, observing traffic rules, and watching out for the danger that may suddenly appear?

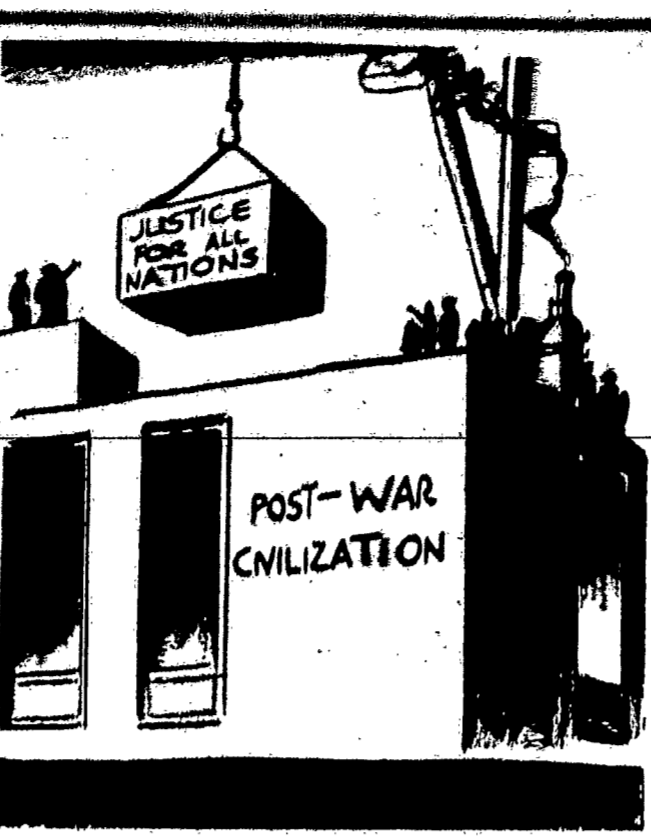
Why not look after the younger children to keep them out of danger, while schooling the older ones in safety practices?

All our vigilance may still find us in an accident as victims or as causes. But vigilance will save us from most accidents, and will be some comfort to us where accidents occur through no carelessness of ours.
