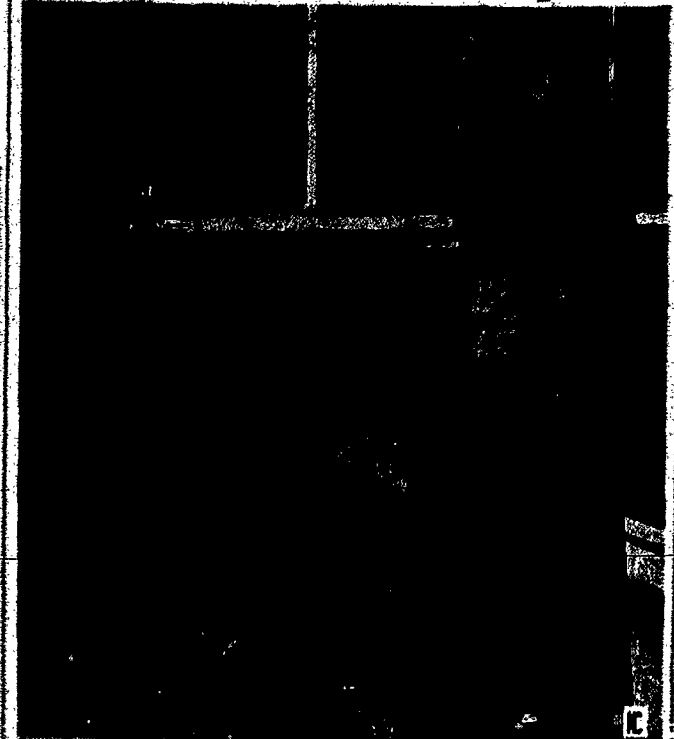

MEXICO'S MUDDLE AWARDS FOR VALOR

Mexican Rivals Call Names Awaiting Election Results

By CHARLES BETTICO MEXICO CITY.—(N. C.)—One month after the elections, both parties—the officially entrenched Mexican Revolutionary Party, M. R. P., and the opposition Revolutionary Party of National Unification, P. R. U. N., claim an overwhelming victory and accuse each other of "grave irregularities."

Appeals have been made to the Attorney General by both sides, but it is not within the province of the Attorney General's Office to pass on the legality of elections, or on the success of this or that candidate. Thus are the prerogatives of Congress, and the most that the Attorney General's Office can do is act against individuals charged with responsibility for electoral fraud, but this would have no bearing on the election as a whole.

The professional politicians are grasping at every possible straw until such time as the announcement of results are made officially and definitely. The time of such announcement is indefinite.

In Roman Rota First Victoria Cross Goes To Catholic

LONDON.—(N. C.)—The first army officer to win the Victoria Cross in this war is a Catholic, Capt. Harold Marcus Ervine-Andrews, of the East Lancs Regiment. He is a former pupil of Stonyhurst College, noted Jesuit school which provided the first Victoria Cross holder of the last war, Lieut. Maurice Deseve of Stonyhurst, who was awarded the Victoria Cross for his gallant leadership of the attack on the Albatross when the Germans were pouring men into Belgium.

REQUIEM MASS IN LONDON FOR CREW OF SUNKEN POLISH SUBMARINE

LONDON.—(N. C.)—Solemn Requiem Mass for members of the crew of the Polish submarine Orzel was attended here by President Raczynski, Prime Minister, the Commander-in-Chief of the Polish navy, and other Polish leaders.

GENEVA.—(N. C.)—The Most Rev. Dr. Müller, Protestant Bishop of Bavaria has informed his clergy that he sees no objection why the members of their congregations should not be admitted to Confession, if they so desire, although he does not wish the Sacrament to be administered in the Protestant Church in general terms.
