Orders Transportation To Spencerport School

Another favorable decision has been handed down by the Commissioner of Education Ernest E. Cole for bus transportation to St. John's School in Spencerport from District No. 12 of the Town of Ogdenville where transportation had been refused.

IN THE MATTER OF THE APPEAL FROM THE ACTION OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF DISTRICT NO. 12 OF THE TOWN OF OGDENVILLE, MONROE COUNTY, IN REFUSING TO PROVIDE PAROCHIAL TRANSPORTATION FOR ELEMENTARY PUPILS.

THE APPEAL IS SUSTAINED. IT IS ORDERED that the trustee of this district proceed forthwith to provide transportation for elementary pupils residing within the district to the nearest parochial school and pay the reasonable cost thereof out of any funds of the district available for such purpose subject to the approval of the district superintendent of schools and the Department. In the event there are no district funds available for such purpose, said trustee is hereby authorized and directed to raise by tax on the taxable property of the district a sum sufficient to pay for same (See subdivision 18 of Section 206 of the Education Law, as added by chapter 405 of the Laws of 1935, see also Section of the Education Law, No. 248, in Matter of District No. 11, Southampton, decided August 28, 1939 Matter of District No. 11, Brookhaven, No. 4289, decided August 31, 1939).

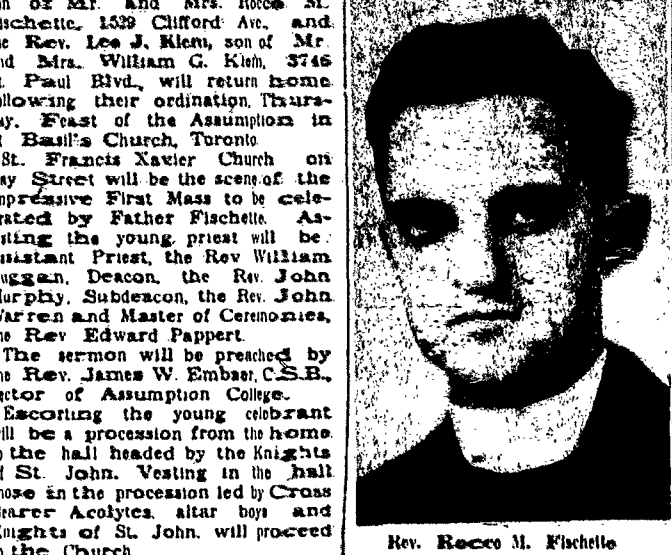
