(NC) - Charging that his was "the first instance in the history of American higher education when a recommendation for a college presidency has occurred his public trial by disciples of the Communist Party, Dr. Dexter M. Keezer, President of Reed College, Portland, Ore., has resigned as Chairman of the Board of Higher Education of New York City to withdraw his name from further consideration for the presidency of the College of the City of New York.
