The cornerstone of the new building at 119 Ann St. is expected to be completed by the building early in November. Plans approved by the Diocesan Building Commission call for a sanctuary and basement building. The basement hall and sacristy entrance will face on Washington St.

Exterior finish will be white stucco with wood trim and leaded glass windows. Ground dimension of the church is 12 feet by 40 feet. Plans to cost \$125,000 will be provided in the near future. The main floor will be finished in the basement. It is intended to provide a hall for church suppers and parties as well as for instruction and society meetings. It will have windows on both sides and a ceiling of acoustical tile. A stairway connects the basement with the main floor and grade entrance. The parish building committee consists of Homer Osborn, John Clark, Bernard Beckett, Louis Albert Edwards, P. M. Manning, Ray Lechner and Martin Ringling.

Friends of the parish are invited by Father Margaret to attend the cornerstone laying on Sept. 13.

707 Year Old Convert Buried

NEW YORK—A Requiem Mass was held Monday at St. Charles Borromeo Church, Harlem, for Anne Warren Jones, 107-year-old convert.

Widely known to her neighbors as "Mama" Jones, she was born a slave in 1833 near Somerville, Tenn. She spent most of her life in the South and witnessed the great changes of the Civil War. She had been a Catholic less than a year.

On Thanksgiving Day last year she came to New York to live with her youngest daughter. Always a deeply religious woman, she became interested in the Catholic Church and took instructions from the Rev. Lawrence Cahill, of the New York Apostolate to the Colored, in her basement kitchen and was baptized.

She died at the thought of her First Communion, she replied: "All my life (over 100 years) I've been planning to leave you all and go to Heaven, but today you brought it down to me."

"Mama's" Conversion will never die in the minds of her fellow converts and parishioners. She was the first of 26 confined that day and was unable on her crutch to go up to the Most Rev. Stephen J. Donahue, Auxiliary Bishop of New York, on the predella. The Bishop took her immediately and went down to "Mama" standing between the altar gates and confirmed her there.

In the brief period of her membership in the Catholic Church, "Mama" Jones was responsible for many converts.

SHRINE TO NOTE 260TH ANNIVERSARY OF DEATH OF KATERI TEKAKWITHA

AURIELVILLE.—The two hundred and sixtieth anniversary of the death of Kateri Tekakwitha, converts to save Indian souls, will be observed September 5 at the Aurielville Shrine of Our Lady of Martyrs, which is on the site of the Indian castle of Ossernenon, where Kateri was born about 1656.

The two major pilgrimages scheduled for the day are the annual Boston pilgrimage and the Third Order of St. Francis from the Greater New York area.

The Most Rev. Edmund F. Gibbons, Bishop of Albany, will preside at the solemn pilgrimage Mass to be celebrated in the Coliseum upon the arrival of the New York pilgrims. The Boston group will arrive earlier.

Among the pilgrims of the day will be delegation of Mohawk Indians from the Caughnawaga Reservation near Montreal, where bones of Kateri are preserved. Included in this group will be tribal chief, Francis Pine. Chief Satorakaronko and Princess Echo, a lineal descendant of Tekakwitha, and the Rev. Michael Jacobus, S. J., first member of the Mohawk tribe to be ordained to the priesthood. Elsie Gibbons is an honorary chief of the tribe, having received the name Tabakakwah. "Chief Brilliant Mind."

Coinciding with the Presidential designation of the day as one for prayer for the peace these will be carried out in the spiritual exercises.

Lately added to the shrine collection of relics and interesting mementos of the North American martyrs are two fragments of bone of Kateri Tekakwitha, which were removed from Caughnawaga in 1885 and which have been preserved since that time at Holy Cross College, Worcester, Mass. These bones were with Latin testimonial will be exhibited at the office of the Shrine Director, the Rev. Raymond F. Goggin, S. J., for the anniversary celebration.

Catholics Remain Firm in Germany

GENEVA.—There are now 11,500 Catholics in Germany, according to official figures received here from Berlin.

The total of priests is over 33,000. Only 3 per cent of the 250,000 Catholics in Germany have been expelled since the war. The great majority of Catholics remain in Germany. The children born of Catholic marriages in 1924 were baptized.
