"Development of self-discipline in the individual is the best contribution which can be made to the development of good citizenship."

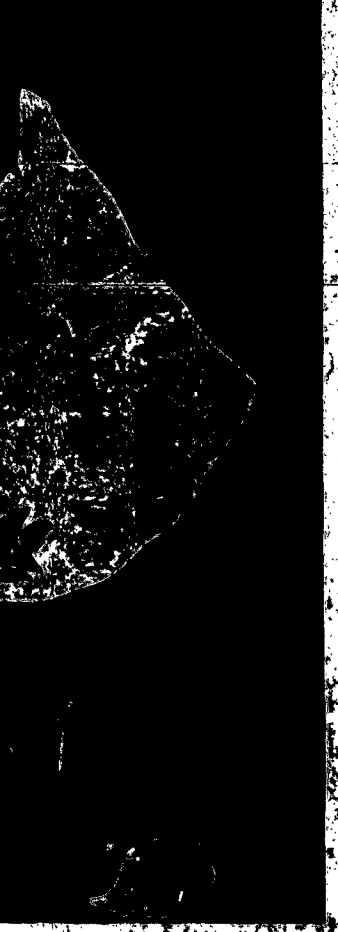
