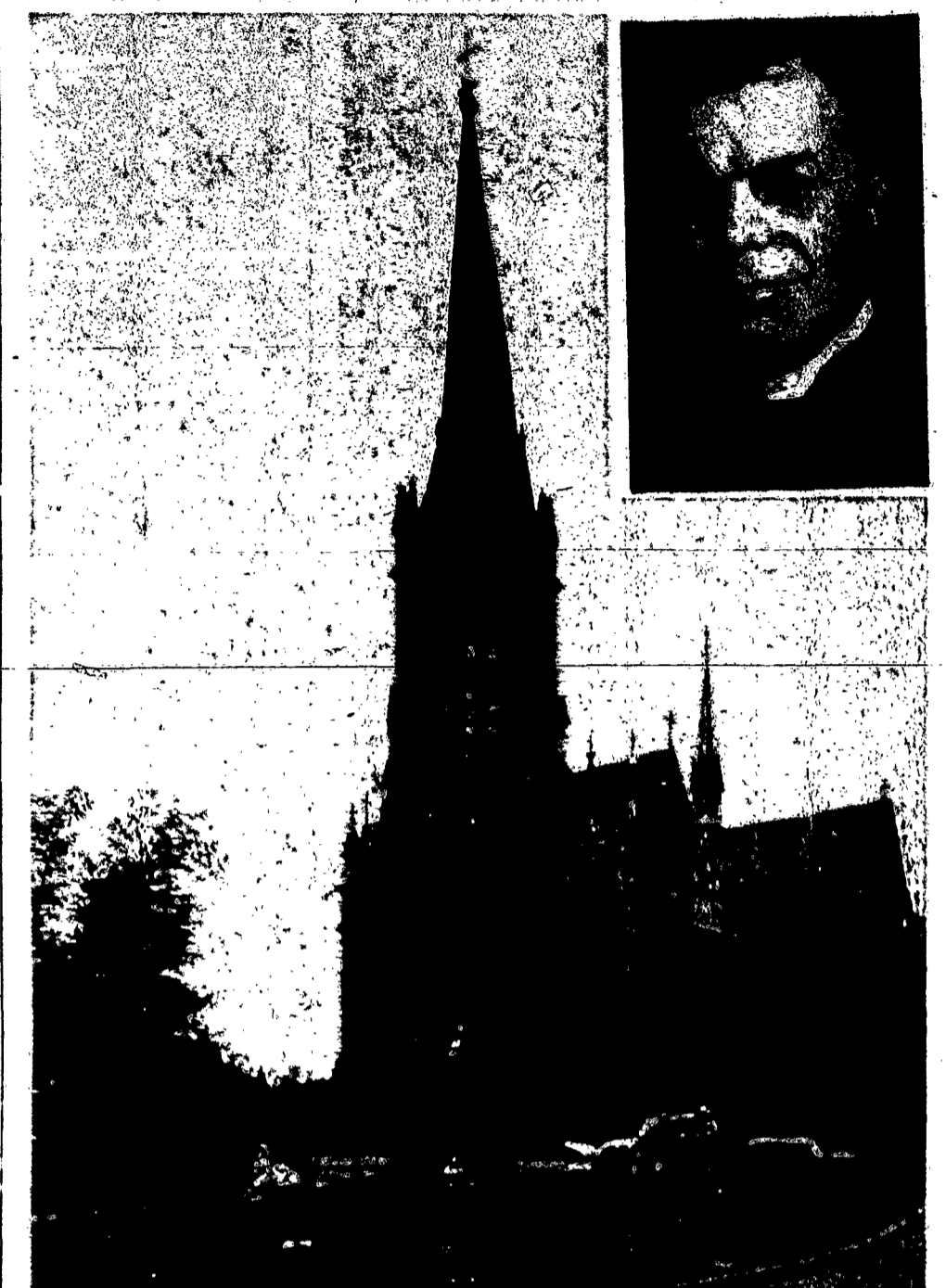
CHARGES FRAUD IN CONTRACEPTIVE ADS

Official 'Time' Criticized For Anti-Vatican Views
