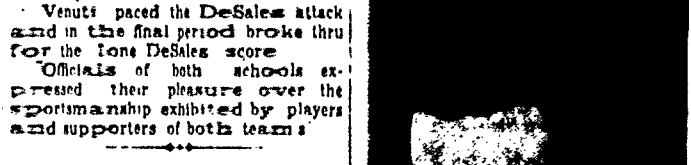

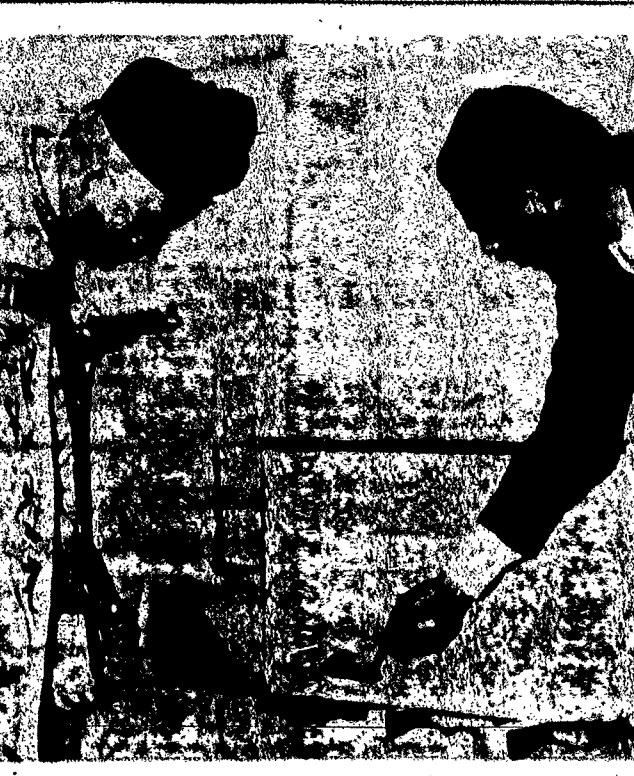
Catechism Taught In Radio Playlets
