COURIER'S CURRENT INEMA COMMENTS

It's odd—how so often all the good pictures come in the same week. Take this one, for instance. You couldn't go wrong at almost any local first-run theater you cared to visit. All of the bills were better than average and, at least in two cases, some of the pictures turned out to be ten better than that. One of these was the picture of Pare Lorentz's completely compelling film, "The Fight for Life."

"They Know What They Wanted"

Since Howard Pizitzer's prize-winning play, "They Know What They Wanted," has waited a long time for an adequate dramatization, Pola Negri made a variation of it in silent picture days and Vilma Banky and Edward G. Robinson made it into an early talkie—both with unhappy results. Now in its current screening, it at last becomes the great picture it should have been all along. It is a strong and thoroughly good film—one of the most intelligent studies of an illicit passion and its effect on the lives of the people—the innocent as well as the guilty—that has been given us. Here is no conventional triangle plot. Here is no attempt to make the man desirable or excusable. Rather, the consequences are vividly and honestly presented. The script brilliantly retains the dramatic power of the play, but eliminates certain objectionable elements that were in the drama. The direction of Garson Kinnel, Hollywood's newest "boy genius," is masterly. The story is a study in characterizations that are completely genuine.

"The Westerner"—A-1

Distinguished by the slick production that always makes a Samuel Goldwyn production, "The Westerner" is far better than the average run of Western films. Superbly directed by another study of the light between the cattle men and the homesteaders in Texas. You've seen that often enough but in this case, the background for the director's study of Judge Roy Bean, one of the greatest racials in Texas history. There really was a "Judge" Roy Bean and some of the things that happen to him in "The Westerner" really did happen. The majority of it is fiction, of course, but it's good entertaining fiction.

"Rangers of Fortune"—A-1

Another story of early Texas familiar in its essentials but done with engaging good-humor that doesn't take the story too seriously, is "Rangers of Fortune." It's a right-about-face for Sam Wood, director of such films as "Our Town" and "Goodbye Mr. Chips" here his story deals with three gay bad men and their adventures and comedy, sputnik and action prevail. The cast is excellent. Fred MacMurray gives a typical MacMurray performance while Gilbert Roland, still badly needing a haircut, is as adroit as the handsome, narrative Sierra Albert Dekker, displays a formerly unrealized sense of comedy as the third of the trio. Although Patricia Montan—the epitome of the sophisticated modern—is badly miscast as the heroine, she makes an attractive heroine. Joseph Schildkraut is a sufficiently sinister villain and Dick Foran is a forthright young Westerner. The picture introduces a new child actress, Betty Everett. She's a homely, appealing and talented youngster.

Other Pictures
Mexican Spiffers Out West (not yet classified). Impressive for the first part but suddenly loses momentum about half way through and winds up with the audience weak from laughter. Leon Errol is responsible for most of it. One of those family pictures—no better, no worse than most of them. "Father Is a Prince" (not yet classified). Nana Bryant is a sympathetic wife but Grant Mitchell overdoes the role of the penny-

In his citation of modern analogues to the state abolition of the Tudors, the dissipation of the Catholic faith and the secret police and any system of Washington, Maynard is as fresh as tomorrow morning's newspaper."

Christian Doctrine Feast Listed Sunday

The Feast of Christian Doctrine takes its place in the Liturgical Calendar of the Church and like Mass Sunday is to remind the faithful of their obligations with regard to Religious Instruction. Father Vogt notes. Catholics are accustomed to think of Feast Days as days on which honor is paid to certain saints personalities in the history of the Church. Father Vogt says: "The Confraternity of Christian Doctrine, which sponsors and promotes the Feast of Christian Doctrine, has many—patrons, all of whom have been noted for their teaching and for their organization of instruction classes." Among them were: St. Augustine, Bishop of Hippo, an outstanding pedagogic whose methods of teaching religion were built upon premises which modern teachers believe to have been discovered only in the present century; St. Charles Borromeo, Archbishop of Milan among the first prelates to see the possibilities of the Confraternity of Christian Doctrine and to disseminate it; St. Peter Canisius, Apostle of the Catholic Reformation in Germany and author of the catechism that did so much to preserve the Faith among the Catholics in southern Germany. St. Robert Bellarmine, the profound Jesuit teacher of the seventeenth century.

St. Louis—The Rev. James I. Shannon, S.J., Director of the Department of Physics at St. Louis University, was celebrant of Solemn Mass Monday at St. Francis Xavier College Church, commemorating his golden jubilee as a member of the Society of Jesus. It was also Father Shannon's seventy-second birthday.
