## POOR CLARE NUNS

Convent in Holy Land Endangered  
Monsignor Testa, the Apostolic Delegate in the Holy Land, sent us this letter:  
"In April, 1939, I wrote to you about the Poor Clares, who are living near Jerusalem. Later you made an appeal for them and the response was generous. Conditions are so bad that I am forced to call on you again. There are twelve professed Nuns in this house. Last year I asked for One Hundred Twenty Dollars to put the house in condition. You sent us this and more in March of this year the roof started leaking. Some minor repairs were made, but now it is leaking again. To cover it with tar paper and gravel and pitch will cost Eighty Dollars.  
The Superiress tells me that the Nuns can live on about Sixty Dollars a month. This amounts to Five Dollars for each Nun. You see, they live very frugally. Sixty Dollars means running the house—not buying food.  
This convent has always been popular with the people. At one time the visitors to the Holy Land were accustomed to leave offerings for the support of the convent. Today there are no visitors. The strife between the Jews and Mohammedans stopped everything even before the war in Europe began.  
Conditions are desperate. Prices are going up and the Nuns are without funds. I am afraid they will be hungry before the winter is over. So please ask your people to send us the Eighty Dollars for the roof before it gets too bad. Ask them to help us supply this convent with food for the winter."  
Will you send us your check or money order for these poor nuns? They are cloistered and have given up the world to serve God and pray for sinners. Do not pass them or close your heart to them. Take care of one Nun for one month.

## What Modernization Can Do



The possibilities that lie in modernization of old homes could hardly be illustrated more graphically than in these pictures of a Horse Owners' Loan Corporation home. The cracked and discolored stucco was removed, and fresh new clapboard siding was substituted. The old-fashioned porch was trimmed down to 1940 proportions and a garage was attached to the house. A simple hip roof served to give new symmetry to the remodeled home. Private lending institutions make loans for this type of work, and these alterations are eligible for financing under the Modernization Credit Plan of the Federal Housing Administration. Even construction of the garage could be financed under the FHA plan, as it became a permanent part of the house.

## New Ideas For Bridal Showers

A bridal shower, well planned and thoughtfully conceived, is one of the most appreciated gestures from a friend to a bride. The shower should be simple in plan, soft in coloring and by all means informal in atmosphere for no matter what entertainment the hostess selects or the guests want to chat and discuss future plans without formal restraint. This, however, does not restrict the type of shower to the same old ones that have been in existence for years. There are many new versions of them and brand new ideas for showers that will add to the success of the shower and please the honored guest. The hostess should plan her shower with the guests and taste of the bride in mind.  
The most popular type of shower is the one which requests each guest to bring a gift although there is also the "one gift shower" where all the guests pool their resources and get one important gift. Again, the hostess must keep the bride's wishes in mind.

## INVITATIONS

Then too she may make her own invitations. A miniature page of a cook book could be made into an invitation to a kitchen shower or pieces of white starched linen or cotton with the invitations written in blue ink to represent blouses might be used. A graceful silver slipper or a hope chest could be fashioned to summon the guests. What could be more appropriate for a linen shower than an invitation written on paper resembling linen in texture or on a corresponding card with a tiny piece of linen pasted in one corner to represent a towel? For a personal shower a rosebud or a hand mirror cut out of stiff pink paper with the name of the guest in the center, and thereon would be most attractive.

## DECORATIONS

The decorations for a shower should be simple so as not to detract from the central feature of the occasion—the presentation of the gifts. A novel decorative presentation and table decorations are all that are used for showers. The basic color scheme is limited to either pink, yellow, green or white or a combination of any of these. If the hostess is depending on store purchases for her decorations:

Nothing is quite so charming to decorate the table as a floral centerpiece. For an early spring shower a spring bouquet of daffodils or tulips with just a few gay pussy willows would be lovely. Snapdragons with stock in the pale colors make an effective centerpiece. Sweet peas, either alone or combined with forget-me-nots or baby's breath are dainty decorations. For a June shower either yellow pink or white roses are the loveliest. Flowers of all combining any one of these with blue or white make a stunning table bouquet. Tapers flanking the floral arrangement should carry out the color scheme.

Other centerpieces might be a pink heart shaped Jack Horner pie holding favors for the guests, a water sprinkler, a dainty crepe paper parasol which may be purchased at the 10-cent store, a kewpie doll dressed in a voluminous crepe paper skirt which conveys favors, a large silver pasteboard slipper kewpie doll, one dressed as a bride and the other as the groom, standing beneath a silver arch fashioned of stiff silver cardboard, or tulips that are open-sided with a cardboard rainbow encircling them.

Nut cups may be purchased at a nominal sum and may take the form of a rosebud, a silver slipper, a girl with an umbrella over her shoulder, a heart shaped basket, or possibly just a dainty cup with an umbrella over it. Usually on these there is a place to write the name of the guest so that extra place cards will not be necessary. Shower table cloths and matching napkins of crepe paper may be purchased also.

In buying bacon it should be selected for its thin end and the even spreading of its fat. It is not a good plan to buy over-fat bacon even though it happens to be the cheapest.

## Wise Housewife Knows How To Buy Merchandise

How often do you go to market? Are you one of those housewives who depend on the grocery store for your shopping for your table but also as to how much you will spend for your food?  
The market man is not to blame if he sells you the most expensive merchandise he has or fails to make his bargain talk convincing enough or perhaps doesn't make it at all when you call up on the phone. Naturally if he can sell you more expensive merchandise he will not bother with bargain, or perhaps will raise his bargain or perhaps will raise his price all when you have spent all the money you want to spend anyway.

## Seasonal Trends

At certain seasons of the year certain vegetables are always cheaper than at other times. ## Materials Used In FHA Houses Must Suit Needs

Materials which are to go into homes offered as security for Federal Housing Administration insured mortgages should be chosen for their suitability to the uses proposed and all structural features should be figured to perform their part in the building with economy and economically according to FHA officials.

FHA is also recommended by the FHA that the structure should be designed so far as practicable to use a minimum of materials in producing a straight-forward structural unit and to avoid conditions leading to uneven shrinkage and settlement or excessive maintenance.

FHA officials also urge that the use of more pretentious dwellings harmonize in quality with each other and with the size and class of home in which they will be used.

## Keeping Teapots Fresh

Do your teapots get rusty smelling when you allow them to stand in a cabinet with the covers on? The trick to prevent that is to allow free circulation of air in the teapot. This is done by putting a piece of paper under the cover so that it cannot quite close. The same idea works when applied to a coffee pot or any covered dish.

## Paint Suggestions

Painters suggest: After a rain, at least four days' delay should pass before painting wood, brick stucco and other absorbent materials with any oil paint. There should be no spouting in the air and damp atmosphere of fog. Fog disappears has passed away. Painting should not start in the morning until the sun has dried up the dampness of night.

## Catching Candles Drippings

For the birthday party or other occasion where candles are used on a cake, cover the fireproof cake top with a paper doily. Then put doilies on the cake over the doily. When the candles are lighted, the doily will catch the drippings, thus preventing the frosting on the cake. When it is time to cut the cake, the candles and doily can be removed easily with the doily.
