#### Legion Told Choice Lies Between Material, Spiritual

"We must make a clear and resolute choice between the material organization of the world and the spiritual order based on faith and animated by charity which is the will."

This was the message given by His Excellency Bishop Kearney at the annual Armistice Day luncheon of the Monroe County American Legion at the Chamber of Commerce.

Armistice Day observance opened with a Solemn High Mass in Old St. Mary's Church at which the Rev. Dr. George F. Kettel, former national chaplain of the American Legion made a strong appeal for vigorous attacks on communism and other subversive elements in the country.

The Mass was celebrated by the Rev. James J. Brennan, county chaplain of the Legion assisted by the Rev. Charles I. Sullivan and the Rev. Joseph M. Donnell. Members of the Legion of the Gold Star Mothers, the World War Mothers and the Knights of Columbus attended. The Knights of Columbus moral society sang the responses.

In the sanctuary was the Rev. Gerald C. Lambert, Knights of Columbus Council 1011, Chaplain.

Clear Head Issue

At the Legion Luncheon His Excellency was presented by Bernard E. Flanagan, president of Security Trust Company and a Knight of Columbus.

The real question at issue today is whether the order we create shall be exclusively a material one or whether it must also be spiritual," the Bishop said.
