The holdover of the Chaplin film, "Great Dictator" meant that the movie week was only two new bills. The new pictures were a pretty unexciting lot not particularly hard to understand, but just pictures. Best of the lot was "The Mark of Zorro"

"The mark of Zorro, in this picture is a cut with a sword on walls or clothes of victims. As we recall, Zorro did it with a whip and on the cheeks of his captives. But after the Fairbanks picture came an epidemic of small boys playing Zorro and making it real by slicing their initials in other small boys' cheeks. So the change this time is probably justified.

Tyrone Power with a tricky mustache and carefully waved hair is not as agile a Zorro as was Fairbanks, but he is adequate enough in the more strenuous phases of his role. The high spot of the picture is a sword duel between Zorro and Basil Rathbone. Much of the time, however, Power spends dallying with the lovely Linda Darnell and the sinister Gale Sondergaard while the audience sits restlessly waiting to get into the action.

"Down Argentine Way"—A-2
That Joe Teresi has become a conductor he proved in the Dvorak Fifth Symphony. I shall not forget the picture of dynamic lines his duoband hands drew in the finale, negro con fuoco. The vertiginous bowing of violins and violas, simultaneous with the horizontal bowing of cellos, were passion stroked.

GREGORIAN MATERIALS IN CONTEMPORARY MUSIC

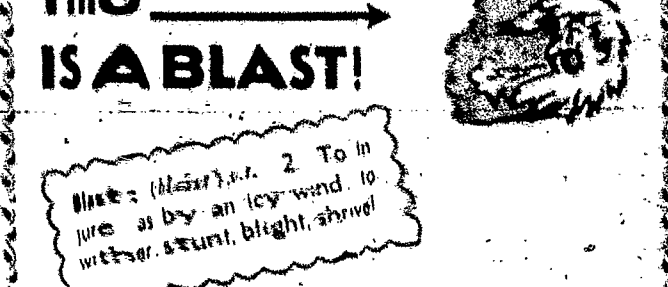
Our first Sunday in Selma and how shall I describe our mission work as we found and counted the only white people in a congregation of about eighty. The altar boys, too, were black and non-Catholics. They attend Mass and instructions regularly but they will not be baptized until they are sixteen unless their parents are received into the Church before that. About fifteen people received Holy Communion one of them a First Communicant.

ORDER OF THE DAY
The primary activities began in earnest. They consist of visiting the sick, poor, giving instructions individually in the Parish House next door, sorting and selling the worn clothing superfluous to the mission. I might say that the latter activity is considered to be very important as it is a means of contacting non-Catholics as well as a means of keeping in touch with Catholics. Each child and adult participate in separate groups.

Perhaps the most interesting in the line of modern compositions is the Symphony Poem entitled "Luz" composed by our own Dr. Hanson. This composition does not utilize the Gregorian theme of the Communion of the Requiem Mass, as many have surmised, but the composer says he took the theme from the Gregorian chant. Dr. Hanson says he wrote it while in Rome where he was studying the chant, and while he was hearing it all around him so that it seemed to take complete possession of him.
