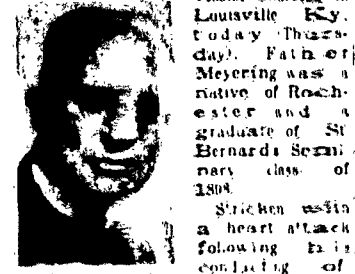
Solemn Rites Honor Memory Of Archbishop

Illinois Priest Rites Set Here

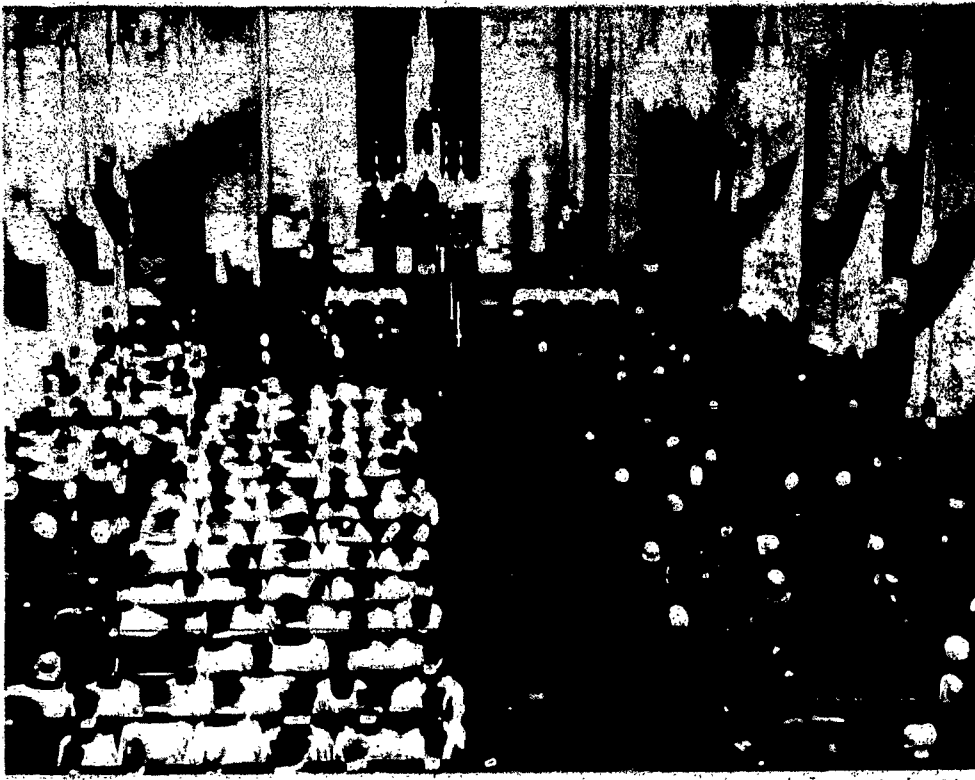
