### 44 Catholic Laymen Oppose Hoover Plan To Feed Europe's Needy

NEW YORK.—The plan of former President Hoover to send food through the British blockade to people in countries occupied by Germany was opposed in a statement released here signed by 44 prominent Catholic laymen, who declared it contrary to the best interests of Christianity and of America.

The statement contended that if some of the supplies did reach those for whom it was intended the supplies would be released for use by the Axis. It was stated that any supplies reaching Europe will be used by the Axis powers as they see fit.

Declaring that the result would be to strengthen Hitler's grip on Europe by increasing his capacity to resist, the statement said: "It is this which our consciences forbid us to permit."

The Nazi-dominated peoples of

Germany and of the conquered territories are systematically de-

prived of every opportunity to

reach their faith to their children," the statement said. "Already German youths as epitomized in Christ and God have learned to blasphemous God."
