**The Long Voyage Home—A-2**

The best picture of the week one of the best pictures in fact that the screen has ever given us is "The Long Voyage Home." This is a picture that is a real masterpiece as a rule but "The Long Voyage Home" does them all. It is a magnificent film—a film that is a masterpiece of art.  
A story of the sea and of the men who sail it, it is a film adapted from the play by Eugene O'Neill about the four plays that he wrote about the sailors of the Long Voyage Home. It is a magnificent picture now charged with suspense, now alive with color and now with tragedy. The story is really four pictures: the visit to the ship by the aggressive little steward, the death of one of the crew, the death of the other, and the death of the captain. It is a superb study in fear and tragedy. It is the only picture since the war that has been made with a completely exceptional cast, by a notable musical score and by the brilliant camera work of Gregg Toland.
