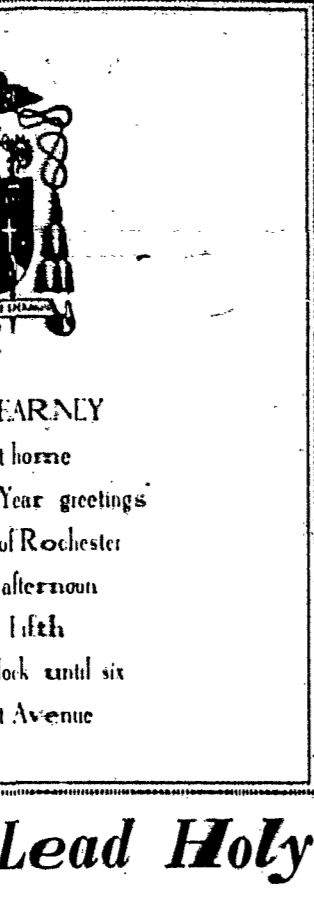
NEW YORK—(NC)—The Babe of Bethlehem wrought the shattering of a smug world's illusions, the Rt. Rev. Msgr. Fulton J. Sheen said Sunday night in his address over the "Catholic Hour."

If man were "naturally good" and "naturally progressive," as some have taught, Monsignor Sheen said, there would have been no need of Our Lord's coming to earth to make men good.

"And as they came to a cave in a mountain, that was used as a stable, they found not the cave man from which our pagans say we evolved, but the God-man who brought Truth to the erring and Hope to the disillusioned. And there they learned the hardest lesson of all: Divinity is always where you least expect to find it."

Pope Gives Five Points To Bring Order In World

VATICAN CITY—His Holiness, Pope Pius XII in his Christmas message broadcast to all the nations, on Christmas Eve, articulated five "indispensable prerequisites" in the search for a new world order.

On the day previous, the Holy Father in a moving appeal to all to join with him in "prospituous prayers and benedictions" for the relief of suffering throughout the world, paid tribute to the generosity and cooperation of the hierarchy in the United States.

The five "fundamental points for the attainment of a new world order" for the world, a year ago by the Holy Father were recalled by His Holiness in his Christmas broadcast, this year.

The two declarations, admirably complementing each other, and made on successive years at the great Feast of Peace, Christmas, impinged, may well become the objective toward which a world "tragedy" unrolled "it was" will strive.

For the "new order" to be established after the war shall end, Pope Pius stipulated: "The first prerequisite is the restoration of peace, which today divides the peoples, together with a renunciation of the systems which have nourished those hates."

Second, triumph over materialism, which today seems to nullify international relations. Third, triumph over the false dilemmas that might make right, which endangers all international relations.

Fourth, triumph over two-sided differences, by continued elimination of the proper and the unjust, with establishment of "aimed" and "economic" justice based on Divine precepts.

Fifth, triumph over egoism, which easily leads to violation of the rights and sovereignty of states and of the proper and the unjust, with establishment of "aimed" and "economic" justice based on Divine precepts.

His Holiness admonished the people to be loyal to the great Feast of Christmas, reminding them that its solemnity does not depend upon external events. He cautioned against undue optimism, as a danger of reality, and equally against pessimism, which would lead to the loss of the "new order."

Non-Catholic Leaders In Remarkable Backing Of Pope's Peace Plan

(By GEORGE BARNARD) LONDON—(NC)—A remarkable and heartening protest has just been made here whereby four outstanding church leaders, including the two highest prelates of the Church of England and the Moderator of the Free Church Federal Council, have expressed themselves in the most emphatic manner in support of the Pope's Peace Plan.
