St. Monica's Parish ROSARY SOCIETY MEETS

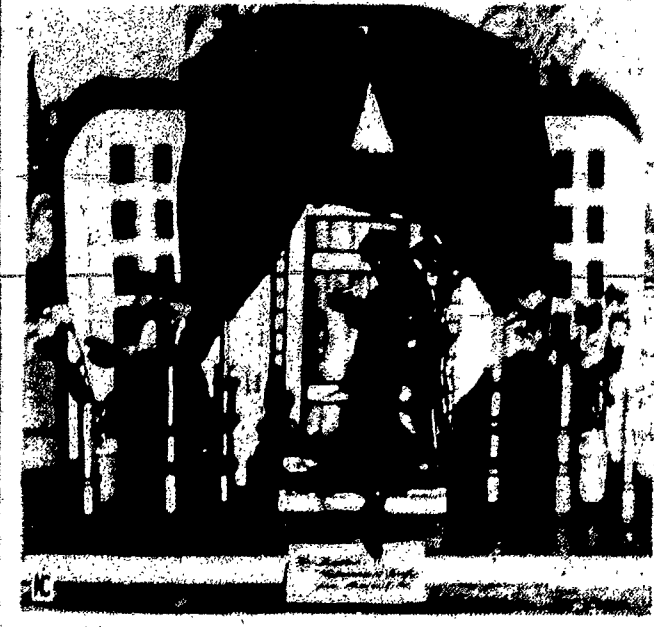
By MARY E. CAUFIELD The regular monthly meeting of the Rosary Society, which is usually held on the first Friday evening of the month, has been postponed one week.

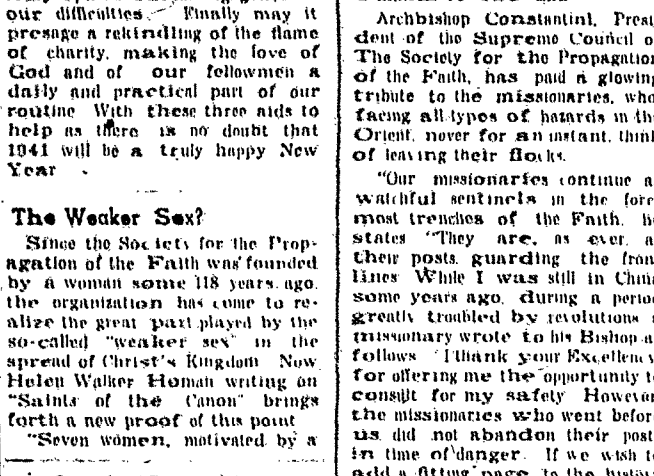
