## PROCEEDS OF PAPERS' CONTEST TO AID STATUE PROJECT IN CAPITAL

HUNTSVILLE, Ind., Jan. 10.—Proceeds from a "Catholic Papers' Contest" sponsored by Our Sunday Visitor here with its diocesan newspaper participating, including the CATHOLIC COURIER, Hobbsport, will be added to the fund which has been set aside for the erection in Washington, D. C. of a large statue of Christ, Light of the World. This statue will be erected in connection with a new building which will house the headquarters of the National Catholic Welfare Conference.

Contestants are asked a total of 30 questions dealing with American history. The questions are being printed in the participating papers over a period of eleven weeks. The contest began last Sunday. There are rewards for early entry in the contest and prompt submission of answers to the questions. A total of \$5,500 is being offered in cash awards. The grand prize is \$2,500 which will increase to \$3,500 if the winner is an early entry. The first prize of \$1,000 is increased to \$1,500 if the winner has entered early. There are proportionate increases for the third prize of \$500, the fourth prize of \$200, the fifth prize of \$100 and the sixth prize of \$50. There are four prizes of \$25 each and one hundred of \$10 each.

## Virtues Discussed

Vatican City—In the presence of His Holiness Pope Pius XII, a general meeting of the Sacred Congregation of the Council was held in the Vatican on Jan. 10. The meeting was presided over by the president of the Congregation, Cardinal Tardini, who discussed the virtues of the Blessed Sacrament of the Eucharist, which was instituted in 1876.

## Blessed Sacrament Housed 24 Hours in London Tower

LONDON—The Blessed Sacrament was given a home for 24 hours in the Tower of London. It is disclosed by the Catholic Times here. The paper states that during a fire which threatened an east London church the Blessed Sacrament was taken to the Tower, where a temporary altar was erected in one of the dwelling houses.

## CATHOLIC PARISH BUYS PROTESTANT BUILDING

PITTSBURGH—A North Side structure which formerly was the Tenth Presbyterian Church and which later became a district headquarters for Jehovah's Witnesses has been purchased for \$15,000 by the Catholic parish and will be remodeled into a Catholic chapel for liturgical-speaking members of the congregation.

The building was built by the Tenth Presbyterian congregation, which later was absorbed by the Second Presbyterian Church. The property stood idle for some time and then was leased by the Jehovah's Witnesses, who named it "Watchtower Auditorium." A great deal of the Jehovah's Witnesses' reading matter was printed in presses in the basement of the building.
