Bomb Hits Hospital; Kills Nuns, Nurses

By GEORGE BARNARD LONDON.—(NY) The mother of a Catholic hospital here and two other nuns were killed when a Nazi bomb hit the building last night. The three nuns had gone to the hospital to deal with an emergency which might have been a high explosive bomb struck the building dislodging heavy machinery and crashed on them. When a bomb hit a large party in the hospital, the nuns and five other members of the staff were killed. The nuns were killed in a cellar elsewhere and were buried but were all rescued. The hospital was completely wrecked. The adjoining church and parish hall were damaged. Twenty-eight fire bombs fell on Westminster Cathedral, Archbishop's House and adjoining buildings during a recent raid by Nazi bombers. All the fires were extinguished by volunteer fire fighters, led by one of the priests on the cathedral staff, and no great damage was done.

The cathedral clergy and the nuns and other laymen form an organized corps for dealing with fire. The St. Thomas More church of the convent of Adoration Holy Trinity at Chelsea was wrecked in another raid.

It is believed that the 100-year-old Tabernacle, the bound volumes of the printed Bible, covering the whole of its life, when the cathedral was destroyed by Nazi fire bombs. The volumes had been moved to another place only a few yards from the cathedral in the London Fire, just a few days before the raid. Both the old and new offices were destroyed.

Another London church which was destroyed some time ago is the church of the Sacred Heart, Convent, St. Paul's. The annual five Sunday Masses are being said in the parish hall.

Though very many London churches have been rendered unusable by the first incendiary and later more accurate attacks on London, I know of no parish which does not continue to have Mass, whatever the difficulties of the situation.

Elsewhere in the country, Mass is being said in many places. In Manchester the handsome basilica of Corpus Christi, served by the North British Fathers (Dominican), has been bombed and destroyed. Some weeks ago Mass had been said in the parish hall which was formerly a glass warehouse. The parish priest will say Mass in the parish house.

Two more churches have suffered in Liverpool one being put out of use. A further school there has been rendered useless.

When the Rev. Wilfred Keefe and the Rev. William Kavanagh of Liverpool were killed in a raid some time ago, the parish priest, the Rev. William Clark, suffered severely from when he was rescued from the hospital and is back in the parish.

The three priests were in a shelter with members of the domestic staff and some parishioners. The housekeeper and two servants were also killed by the bombs which killed the two priests.
