that he was tricked by the wise men, etc.

In the story about the laborer in the vineyard, the revision says they received every man his due, not "penny" as heretofore. It was felt that the word "penny" was wrong and misleading, and since we have no coin which closely follows the evaluation of these ancient pieces, the original is more likely should be used.
