LONDON - With his appointment as Joint Parliamentary Secretary of the Ministry of Agriculture, the Duke of Norfolk becomes the only Catholic in the present Government of Great Britain.

His Holiness Pope Pius XII has named the Duke a Knight of the Order of the Cross in recognition of his representation of King George VI at the Coronation of the present Pontiff. His Excellency the Most Rev. William Coffey, Apostolic Delegate to Great Britain, visited the Duke's ancestral castle to bestow the insignia. King George has given the Duke permission to wear the insignia on public occasions.
