The problem of youthful offenders against the law and the best manner of dealing with them takes on special interest at this time, when the State Legislature is confronted with an appeal to pass a law authorizing a plan that has been found effective.

In two counties of the State the magistrates of the Adolescent Courts have been substituting a wayward minor charge for a felony charge when dealing with youths between sixteen and nineteen.

An important influence in the successful reclamation of these boys is the interest taken in them by their religious leaders. Priests, ministers, rabbis, have been called in to act as members of their respective faiths.

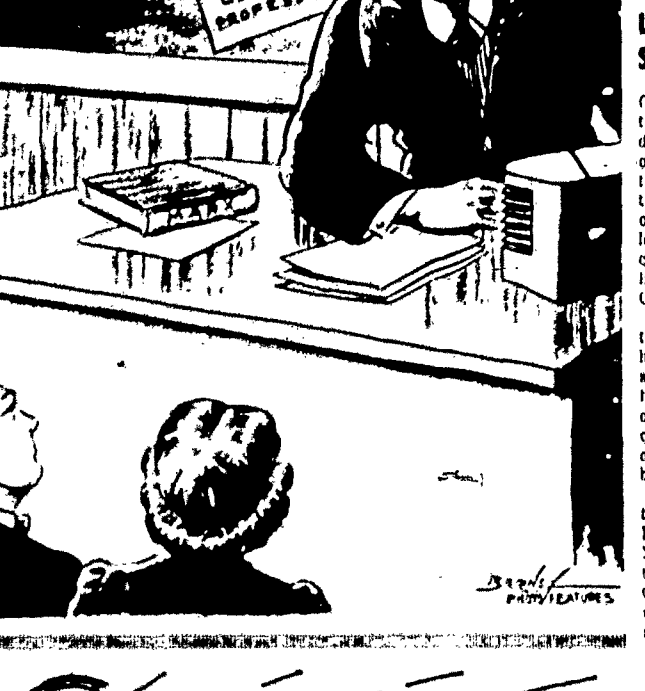
