National, State Heads Hear Bishop's Praise Of Verrein Units Work

His Excellency, the Most Rev. James E. Keane, was received last Sunday afternoon by the delegates and members of the Catholic Central Verrein of America, Rochester Branch, and the National Catholic Women's Union, Rochester Branch, at a meeting of the two organizations in St. Joseph's Hall.

The Bishop addressed the gathering and at the conclusion of his remarks the Rev. Stephen K. Huber, CSSR, Spiritual Advisor of the Men's Branch, thanked the Bishop on behalf of the organization. Bishop Keane referred to the early history of the Church and to the social work done in those early days. He stated that it was carrying out the two great commandments, "Thou shalt love thy Lord thy God and thy neighbor as thyself." He stated that the Central Verrein following the program which has characterized the organization from its beginning manifested in the lives of the Christians and in that respect should in practice the spirit of antiquity.

He stated further that the Central Verrein in shaping its program to meet the conditions of the day gave evidence of its modernity. There are many phases of social work which have been developed by the leaders of the Central Verrein that they have been able to pick out and further what was worthy while.

CATHOLICS IN THE CITY OF DANABURG
Church started near Place St. Paul visited

In the Act of the Apostles, Chapter 1, we read the account of St. Paul's conversion in the way to the City of Damascus in the Twenty-fifth Verse of the Ninth Chapter, we read how the Disciple of St. Paul let him down from the wall in a basket because the Jews wanted to kill him.

Archbishop Leppin, the Apostolic Delegate in Syria, writes to us: "To every Christian and to every one who loves the mission of the Holy Spirit, the conversion of the Mohammedans is always an interesting task. Today the Christians of Damascus are few and of these the Catholics are only a fraction. The Mohammedans dominate the city. They have everything."

"We are struggling to build a small church near the old St. Damascus where St. Paul remained after his conversion and from which he escaped the fury of the Jews. The poor people purchased the land, the walls are up, but they need the material for the roof and the floor. An Altar must be purchased and a good sized picture of St. Paul. They need Two Hundred and Forty-five Dollars to finish this little Church."

"I could never explain to you what it will mean to have this Church. It will give our people a standing in the city. It will give respect for them. I am sure it will mean converts. I hope you will be able to send us the money to finish what has been started. For the story of 'Moving Day' it is another step forward in the process of the becoming of a city. It is another grand indication that the countries of this hemisphere are getting together and iron out common problems without using force."
