Poster Contest Launched By Mission Crusade

**Entry Deadline May 5
For 7 to 12th Grades**

A poster contest has been launched this week by Rev. John S. Randal, director of Propagation of the Faith, to focus attention on the national convention of the Catholic Students' Mission Crusade to be held in Rochester June 27-30.

Pupils from the schools to the Twenty Cities of the parochial schools of the Rochester diocese will participate, according to the Rev. John M. Duffy, diocesan superintendent of schools.

Preliminary work is now under way in the various participating schools. Final entries must be submitted to the Propagation of the Faith headquarters by May 6. Cash awards will be offered to the sectional winners.

The submitted posters will publicize the National Mission Crusade Convention when over 500 clergy, religious and laymen from the country will journey to Rochester. Those expected to take part in the convention program include Archbishop John T. McNicholas of Cincinnati, president of the Crusade, Archbishop Francis J. Heenan of Dubuque and Bishop Frank A. Hill, first organizer of the Mission Crusade.

Auburn Catholic Title Won By Holy Family 'Flyers'

AUBURN—The 1940-1941 Championship in the Catholic Church Basketball League here was captured by Holy Family's Purple Flyers as a result of their 33-30 victory over St. Peter and Paul's Blue and Gold basketeers in the third and deciding game of the final series played at the Roman A. G. court in Clark Street.

With the championship at stake, both quintets went into the final game all tied up with one win and one loss apiece, results of the first two series being:

Sparked by "Babe" Hynman, captain of the group, Holy Family's flyers took an early period lead of 8 to 6. With "Hap" Hulick scoring the first nine points, the Saints caught the Flyers just before the half-time whistle sounded and both teams left the floor tied.

Returning to action after the rest period the two teams continued the nip and tuck type of play that has been characteristic of these play-off contests, as well as of this year's league race. Two buckets each in the first half shot by Hynman and a double assist by "Hap" Hulick, who played with a brace on his injured knee, were equalled by each from Polanski and Bognar, to send the cup contenders into the fourth and final frame deadlocked once more.

Foul shots decided the contest in this period as the Dempseymen sank all of the seven gift shots given them while Coach Mike Baynes' boys were collecting one each. Fred Bunn and Hulick kept the sturdy Ukes in the game with two and one baskets respectively in the quarter.

Bobby Hapner tossed the only field goal for the Flyers in this heat up until the last half minute. With but thirty seconds remaining by one point the Baymen tried desperately to gain possession of the ball but as was almost always the case they piled up two close and George Tonk broke through to register the last two points of the night to give the Dempseymen the game and the championship.

Synott led the champions' attack with five baskets and seven free throws for a total of 17 points, while Hulick kept the courageous Ukes in the running with 15 marks.

The All-Americans placed by John "Muss" Meola dived the St. Alloys five in the prelim, 47-28. Frisell and Currier met 24 points to be the main guns for the losers.
