5-Point Peace Plan of Pope Call NCCS Set-up Spiritual Armory

Bishops Stress

WASHINGTON - (N. C.)Directing public attention again to the five points which must form the basis of any peac that is to be just and lasting, the Administrative Board of the National Catholic Welfare Conference today called for prayers for the victims of war, for a just peace, and for the guidance of

America's civil authorities.
The Archbishops and Bishops spoke through a statement. It was made public following the regular semi-annual meeting here this week in which the Administrative Board discussed relief and other

subjects.
Following is the complete text of the message of the Administrative Board of the National Catholic Welfare Conference:

The American people has through orderly democratic action, expressed its solemn judg-ment that to be safe in the world today our nation must be strong. That judgment is reflected in the greatest defense effort in the hisadequate program of national defense, as we see it, embraces both strength in arms and strength in spirit. With armed strength, it is not for us as Bishons to deal. We leave that to our civil and military authorities. Our particular part in any pro-gram of national defense must have to do with the things of

We are deeply concerned. therefore, with seeing to it that the spiritual influences of their home communities shall follow our boys who answer their country's call to train themselves to be their country's defenders if the need arise Our Government has followed the best of American traditions in entrusting the task of maintaining morale for camp communities and defense areas to private agencies whose service is inspired and guided by faith in God and love for man. We deeply appreciate the confichallenge it carries and the cooperation it promotes.

Agency of Bishops
The National Catholic Community Service is the agency which the Bishops of the Catholic Church in the United States have commissioned to do their share in this providential work. In doing this work on a national scale, the National Catholic Community Service is associated with similar agencies, representing our fellow citizens and other faiths in the United Service Organizations for National Defense. A nation-wide appeal for funds to carry on this work will be made during the month of June. We are confident that the soul of America will give a generous answer to this appeal for the means to throw the saving influences of home and church around the young manhood of America in whose hands the defense of all that we hold dear will finally rest. We are confdent, too, that our Catholic peoin making this answer an elo-

quent expression of their interest in the souls of their soldier-sons The will of America today is set on peace, not war, as the sim of our defense program. The strongest defense weapon with which we can equin the Amerithe kind of peace that constitutes our ideal. An august voice has sounded again and again in an America still at peace, as well as in a Europe already at war. applying to the conditions of our day the Gospel message of peace on earth to men of good will. In his Christmas allocution of 1939, Pope Pius XII laid down these five essential points of world or-der, and therefore of enduring

world peace: First The assurance to all nations of their right to life and independence—the will of one nation to live never justifying the death sentence of another. econd - Progressive disarma ment, spiritual as well as ma-terial, and security for the el-

fective implementing of agree-ments to this end. Third — Juridical institutions of peace terms and previding for revisions called for by changing conditions. Fourth—Satisfaction of the fair demands of intional and racial

mineration.

Fifth—A deep some of respond-bility for the observance of the precepts of justice and charity among men and na-
