GALESVILLE, Wis.—Gale College, here, has been purchased by the St. Louis Province of the Society of Mary for a novitiate, according to an announcement of the Rev. Fr. Bernard P. Juergen, S.M., Provincial. Gale College, originally Galveston University, one of the oldest schools in Wisconsin, was founded in 1854 and chartered by the State of Wisconsin April 1, 1854. Gale University, first under the direction of the Methodist Episcopal Church, was transferred to the Presbyterians in 1877 and to the Lutherans in 1901. The school has been closed since August, 1935. The institution will henceforth be called "Marynovitiate."

Vatican Radio Cites Error in Reporting Pope's Plea

LONDON — Some reports of the greater force and erily by the enemy. After quoting French and Swiss newspaper comment on the Easter broadcast, the Vatican Radio announcer said: "The point most stressed in comment is the anxiety of His Holiness that the belligerents should not introduce new and more terrible methods of destruction which would hinder the cause of peace by still further widening the gulf between them." Reports still arriving at the Vatican, the announcer said, show the value of radio in bringing the words of His Holiness to his people. Thus, the announcer added, "It is clear that the voice of the Pope has once more been heard above the din of battle, calling men to a resolution of the spiritual values which alone will save humanity from itself."

French Pastors Given Gasoline Each Week

MONTE CARLO — The use of gasoline in occupied France is limited to those in the service of the State or society, such as Prefects, physicians, those in charge of food distributions, etc. But pastors who serve more than one parish are authorized to use it on Sundays and Thursdays within their districts. With thousands of priests and Religious being held as prisoners, and still others killed or incapacitated, one priest frequently has to serve a number of parishes sometimes too far apart to be reached on foot or bicycle. The Thursday permit is to enable the priest to give catechism instruction to the children.

Photos Feature 1941 'Niaganan'

NIAGARA UNIVERSITY N. Y. A radical departure from the traditional type of collegiate year-books was noted last Friday when the 1941 Niaganan made its appearance on the campus of Niagara University. Daniel W. Casey, Burke N. Y., is editor of the publication. Departing from the stereotyped posed picture heavily printed book, the 1941 Niaganan is dominantly pictorial with little printed matter as possible. Object of Casey and his staff was to catch the spirit of Niagara and her campus life with the camera's lens, and every department activity and event were subjected to countless shots and bulbs. The book is dedicated to the Rev. Michael F. Nagle, C.M., Ph.D., professor of religion and letters, in recognition of his long years of service to the university and her students, particularly the seniors. Robert X. Leonard of Astoria, La., handled the business affairs of the annual. The Rev. O. E. Morton, C.M., is faculty moderator of the publication. The year-book numbers 128 pages and is divided into five sections: university, mind, body, soul, enthusiasm. Informality in the posing of pictures was stressed to the utter exclusion of posed groups and scenes. Over 1,000 pictures were accumulated and inspected, of which 600 were used in the publication. Ivory colored paper, with dark brown, is the chief color scheme, which is set off with two-tone colors.
