Congregation of Rites Gives New Feast to Rochester

Feast of St. John Fisher, Bishop of Rochester, May Now Be Celebrated with Special Mass and Office In This Diocese

In reply to a petition of His Excellency Bishop Kearney of Rochester that he might insert in the Calendar and Proper of this diocese the feast of St. John Fisher, Bishop of Rochester, the Sacred Congregation replied:

"The Sacred Congregation of Rites, by virtue of the special faculties granted to it by His Holiness graciously accedes to this request and hereby permits the celebration of the Feast of St. John Fisher in the Diocese of Rochester on the twenty-second day of June, with the rank of a 'minor double.'

"In accordance with the rubrics the Office and Mass are to be taken from the Common of one martyr; with the exception of the orations and the Litany of the second nocturn which are proper."

From this year forward, then, the diocese will celebrate each year the Feast of St. John Fisher, martyred Bishop of Rochester, on the twenty-second of June.

War Keeps New Priest Ontario Credit Unions From U.S. Assignment Have 2 Million Assets

LEAVENWORTH, Kan.—Because of the difficulty of wartime ocean travel, the Rev. Joseph Gewelhoff, ordained in Rome for the Diocese of Leavenworth, has been granted a dispensation by Most Rev. Paul C. Schreiber, Bishop of Leavenworth, to return to his native Germany. Temporarily Father Gewelhoff will engage in parochial work there.

WINDSOR, Ont.—In 1938 there were but 16 credit unions in Ontario, but last year this number had increased to 67 with assets of nearly \$2,000,000. P. M. Devlin, Ontario Minister of Agriculture, told the annual banquet of the Harvey Credit Union held in Blessed Sacrament Church here.

The year bad debts in the Ontario credit unions amounted to only \$35 or three hundredths of one per cent.
