inspired Owen are well cast, too, but it's all Crowder's picture. She has lost many of her annoying mannerisms and gives a good theatrical portrayal in an interesting melodrama.

"Flame of New Orleans"—A-2. Rene Clair, the Lubliner of French films. Norman Kraska, the screen writer responsible for some of the best pictures, Joe Pasternak, the producer of the Danna Durbin film. With a director, writer, producer combination like this, the picture should have been an outstanding picture.

"A Woman's Yarn"—B. John Crowder, who has long heeded after the master things of the drama, plays a strong role in "A Woman's Yarn" and makes a lot more sense of the picture than the average actor would make of it.

This time it is Brenda Marshall who plays the beautiful dipomat who lures men to their doom. David Bruce, her leading man, seems a little stiff and self-conscious in contrast to more experienced popular like Virginia Field, Rose Hobart, Jerome Cowan, Dorothy Tree and Heather Angel who do the supporting cast.

"Rookies on Parade"—A-2. uses the old college musical formula. The difference is that the campus locale is switched to an army camp, but there are still all of the trappings of the variety show with army headless taking the places of coeds.

If you ever get a chance to catch it, I'd recommend seeing "Crisis of Conscience," an Italian film must program. "A Night in the White House"—A-2. is a modernized version of the Butterfly theme... well acted by lovely Maria Cebotari and Lucy English, since performed by everyone else. But the apex of the picture is in its music, particularly in the lengthy condensation of the "Madame Butterfly" opera.

### QUERIES and REPLIES

Q. In a church I recently visited there were four figures which I didn't quite understand. Some one told me they represented the evangelists. Please tell me about them.

A. St. Matthew is represented by a human head because he began his Gospel with the human ancestry of Christ. The lion the dweller in the desert, is emblematic of St. Mark who opens his Gospel with the mission of St. John the Baptist, "the voice of one crying in the wilderness."

Q. Why is it that so many people outside the Church attack the Gospel of St. John?

A. The purpose of the Gospel of St. John is to show forth very clearly the Divinity of Christ. It is attacked therefore, by those who wish to undermine or overthrow the teaching that Christ is the Son of God. It is true that the Gospels of Saints Matthew, Mark and Luke also prove the Divinity of Christ. Their object is, however, to narrate the life of Christ rather than to propound any particular doctrine.

### FUNDS AMONG POOR MARK ENCYCLICALS

BOGOTA.—To commemorate the fiftieth anniversary of the Encyclical of the Encyclical Rerum Novarum, and the tenth anniversary of the Encyclical Quadragesimo Anno, the Legislature of Antioquia has set aside a considerable sum of money to be distributed among the laborers and peasants of that state.
