

With the recent numerous appeals in behalf of Chinese relief we are apt to believe that this vast country is dependent entirely upon the outside world for assistance. On the spiritual side we may feel also that missionaries are working in the priests, brothers and sisters who are laboring for the conversion of the people of the Flower Kingdom. However there is another side to the picture as is evidenced by the recent pastoral of Bishop Massa, O.F.M., Vicar Apostolic of Hankow.

The clear vision of His Excellency foretold the difficulty for missionaries here confronted with those countries which formerly had been veritable supply centers for manpower and missionary aid. Hence he appealed to the people of his own Vicariate to the missionaries and faithful alike to aid in fostering the four great mission-aid organizations of the Church. The Society for the Propagation of the Faith, the Holy Childhood Association, the Society of St. Peter and the Missionary Union of the Clergy. In his pastoral he instructs both priests and people to take an active part in the mission apostolate, informing them that they must no longer content themselves with remaining on the receiving end but assume their rightful station on the giving.

Certainly this is tangible proof that the Church is truly established in the very heart of China.
