Christian Principles Basis Of Education

HAVANA—Christian principles as the basis of Democracy and, therefore, of national education, are called to the attention of teachers in the official schools of Cuba by Minister of Public Instruction Remos.

In a circular sent to all the teachers, Dr. Remos says that each teacher is free to practice the religion of his choice and, furthermore, must be careful to avoid offending the religious convictions of others.
