With the thought of school examinations, and teachers left behind, some 3,000 Scouts of the Rochester Council will open camp this evening at the Annual Camporee, which is held at the Warren Cutler Scout Reservation.

As in previous years, troops will camp by divisions under a divisional chief, while the entire camp will be directed by Gabriel Rappaport, District Commissioner of the Liberty Division. A group of selected Senior Scouts will serve on the camporee staff as a committee of various administrative committees headed by district and neighborhood commissioners.

A mass campfire held in a natural amphitheater near the camp entrance will open the three-day Camporee tonight. A parade featuring a ceremony of rededication to the principles of the Boy Scout Oath and Law, and a memorial service to Lord Baden Powell, founder of Scouting, will be conducted Saturday afternoon. Divisional campfires will be held Saturday evening. Sunday church services will be held for scouts of the various faiths. The Catholic Camporee tonight, a parade featuring a ceremony of rededication to the principles of the Boy Scout Oath and Law, and a memorial service to Lord Baden Powell, founder of Scouting, will be conducted Saturday afternoon.

The Rochester Council Sea Scout Base on Irondequoit Bay will open this summer for a 10 week period, extending through Labor Day. Father Bohler, portmaster, will be quartered on the location with headquarters in a cottage recently obtained by the Council.

The daily program calls for a variety of activities, including Sea Scout Advancement work from 10 A. M. to 5 P. M. Among the other activities of the season will be swimming, sailing, rowing, canoeing, and maritime seamanship. Sea Scout Patrols meet regularly in the summer here at the base. Patrols wishing to reserve a day at the base are requested to call Portmaster Bohler at the base one week prior to the desired date.
