VICHY.—According to the latest regulations regarding the line of demarcation between occupied and unoccupied France, individual French citizens will be authorized to cross in the case of a funeral, serious illness, or birth involving a close relation or intimate friend, providing certain formalities are complied with. Similar provisions are made covering family reasons, personal health, marriage, permanent return to the home, visit to a seriously wounded person who has recently returned from captivity, legal matters, recovering a child, or for the marriage ceremony of a son or daughter.

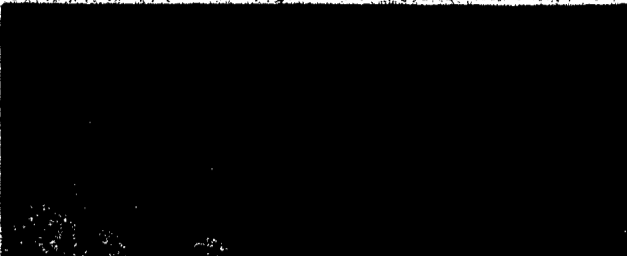
