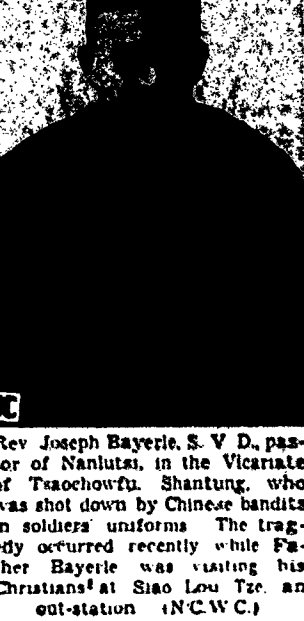
Service Center In Nation's Capital Opened By NCCS

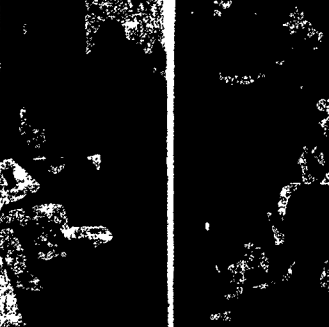
