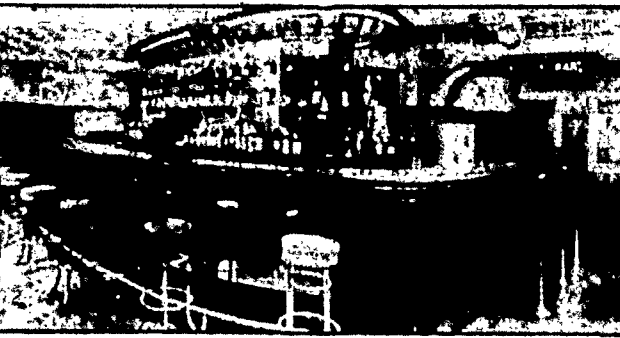

continued to maintain their motive for fighting but even backed up the gangster's former friend and helped him to win his end of the battle.

"That is a pretty fair description of the present position of the allies.

To Save All Men  
 "They have no intention of pretending that the system of the Centre is diabolical and the Oppu angelic.

"I will unsway no word," our Prime Minister told you and us the other evening, "that I have spoken about Communism."

I need hardly tell you that the Catholic Church is so opposed to the doctrine of "Socialist Communism" that if there were any reason to suppose that the motives and objects of the British Empire were to be altered because of the entry into the war of Soviet Russia, no decent Catholic would have the heart to continue to bear arms.

"But it is absurd to talk of Christian civilization as though its fruits can be enjoyed only by practicing Christians. Your people and mine, in their determination to help China, have not, so far as I know, pretended that China is a Christian nation. But Christ came to save all men. The moral code of Christianity is of universal application. The dignity of the children of God, their right to work out their salvation, these are abundant motives for Christian endeavor whether or not the victims of aggression are yet enlightened by the gift of faith.

Prayers in Russia  
 "Atheistic Communism is a soul-destroying philosophy and I was glad to hear Mr. Churchill say on Sunday night 'I see Russian soldiers guarding their homes where mothers and wives pray'—ah—for there are times when we pray for the safety of their loved ones for the return of the bread winner of the champion of their protector."

It is naive of the Left Wing misanthropes and credulous tourists returning from the U. S. A. to proclaim that religion has been banished from the hearts of the Russian people.

"Dictators may wear the trappings of almighty power but they cannot in a generation drive out the spirit of God.

"In my first few days in Soviet Russia I often questioned young people about their religious belief. Invariably they laughed at it and said that their culture was modern. They had no need of God. But when I knew them better I discovered that many of them were blurring for fear of being discovered as believers. One brilliant student at a Moscow university who gave me our first encounter at the defense of atheism. I last saw at Mass in one of the few Moscow churches still open.

Cleaner Tabernacle  
 "There are some devils which are exorcised only through suffering. It may be that in God's Providence the sufferings of war will restore to the Russian leaders and people the Christian inheritance which was once their proud possession. There was room for reform in Russian Christianity and perhaps after wandering in the desert they will build in Russia a cleaner and newer tabernacle.

"Hateful and bloody as was the Bolshevik persecution of Christianity, it was by comparison with that of the Nazis, open and honest. It is true that at the beginning they subtly suggested to the more steadfast believers that Bolshevism was a New Christian Order and that Christ was a Communist deceived few.

"Hitler has deceived many. It is true that he does not pretend that Christ Our Lord was a National Socialist. His references are more blasphemous.

"Tonight I have time only to warn you of this that the Nazi pose that they are saving Europe from Bolshevism is an insult to the intelligence of Christians throughout the world. No man is likely to be deceived at the prospect of being saved from tuberculosis on condition that he be infected with the germ of cancer.

Cannot Buy Soul  
 "Hitler is attempting to appeal to the sentiment of Catholics in what he now calls his crusade against Bolshevism. When he struck down Poland he was crusading against murderers. His French crusade was against Jewish Freemasonry. His English crusade was against demagogues. He told the East that he was the socialist champion against capitalism. He tells the West that he is the European champion against Communism. Surely no one can be deceived.

"There is no exchange that a man can give for his own soul. Certainly Hitler will not buy the souls of Catholics by the promise of giving them new missionary fields of saving them from persecution by the atheist. The Church has never been afraid of bloody persecution, though Pope Pius XI groaned in spirit when he wrote his famous Encyclical 'Mitr Brenner' against the bloody international persecution of the Church under National Socialism.

"The Catholic Church would not ask the apostate Hitler to fight her battles. Of him the Church has but one request to make that he speak less frequently of the Lord God as though He were an accomplice in the annihilation of peoples, but rather pray the Lord God to give him the grace to win the greatest victory that any man can ever gain, a victory over his own sinful pride."

heat of struggle, nevertheless, it brings comfort to observe that many authorized voices already speak in this vein, and let it be known that the result of military victory cannot prescind from respect for moral principles, which alone are capable of giving support and firmness to the fundamental column of the rights of peoples."

Spirit of "Serum Novarum"  
 "Pope Pius emphasized too the importance of social justice in the preparation for social peace. Ambassador Schreiber had made mention of Pope Leo XIII's Encyclical 'Serum Novarum.'

"The spirit of 'Serum Novarum,' the Holy Father said, 'is the spirit of peaceful order and the systematized evolution of sentiments and social realizations. Nevertheless, it is also the spirit of resolute decision and initiative in favor of the better and juster cause. The light that diffuses itself from this historic message,' the Sovereign Pontiff continued, 'shines over all men of good will, and proceeds from the eternal bill from which salvation must come to us.'

Ambassador Schreiber, presenting his credentials, pronounced words of homage, and Pope Pius XII replied with an expression of his deep paternal affection for the Peruvian people, calling them the 'nephews and representatives of two civilizations which wrote ineffaceable pages in the history of humanity.'

"The Faith of the Peruvians," the Holy Father added, "does not contemplate only the past, but also the future. He said Peruvians not only have been faithful in the continuation of those traditions which are the basis of their country's spiritual patrimony, but that this traditional Catholicity gives luminous proof of its intimate force and indomitable vigor even in these times when, in consequence of the influence of other currents, the activity of the Church has had to suffer painful restrictions."

Prayers in Peru  
 "Watered with the sweat of her apostles, bathed with the blood of her martyrs, ennobled with the heroic virtues of her Saints the Church in Peru even in times of trial showed herself faithful and worthy of her past and today finds in the sentiments of the nation a new impulse towards a more intense surrender to the high duty of promoting the spiritual and cultural progress of the people entrusted to her wisdom and maternal care." His Holiness said.

The Holy Father was delighted with the sentiments of filial devotion expressed by Ambassador Schreiber, showing that the President and Government of Peru are in true relations with the Holy See an excellent guarantee for rendering the principles of the Catholic religion efficacious for public and private welfare.

Pope Pius charged the Ambassador to convey to his Peruvian brethren the Holy Father's cordial wishes and his blessing.

**LITHUANIAN BISHOP, 3 PRIESTS REPORTED SLAIN**

CHICAGO (N.C.)—The slaying of the Most Rev. Justus Staughalis, Bishop of Telava, Lithuania, and three Lithuanian priests is reported in a cablegram received by Braugas, Lithuanian daily newspaper here from one of its European correspondents.

The cablegram also reports that 250 priests have been arrested in and deported from Lithuania and other Baltic countries.

**Appointed Military Ordinary Of Chile**

VATICAN CITY—The Most Rev. Carlos Labbe Marquez, Bishop of Iquique, Chile, has been appointed Military Ordinary of Chile and assigned to the titular See of Leuce.

**Noted Priest Dies**

Quebec.—The first Franciscan to join the Order after its restoration here the Rev. Joseph-Marie Roy, O.F.M., is dead at the age of 77. His early ministry was exercised in England, France and the Holy Land but he has been stationed in Canada for the past 31 years.

**NEW BILL OF RIGHTS LEADERSHIP IN PEACE**

**Leadership Of Americas For United World Urged By CAIP**

WASHINGTON (N. C.)—Leadership by the United States and all the Americas for a united Europe, a united world, and "a new and better era" is proposed in a report on "America's Peace Aims" prepared by several committees and sub-committees of the Catholic Association for International Peace and issued by its executive committee. The report includes supplementary statements on the rights of men and peoples and on alternative forms of European and world organization, both economic and governmental. It was prepared on an instruction from the executive committee to draft a statement on American cooperation for peace in accord with the Pope's Christmas address of 1939.

**International Bill Of Rights Proposed**

WASHINGTON (N.C.)—Acceptance by the nations of the world of an International Bill of Rights is proposed by the Rev. Wilfrid Parsons, S.J., Catholic University of America, in an appendix to a report on "America's Peace Aims" just issued here by seven committees of the Catholic Association for International Peace. The proposed Bill of Rights, which calls for respect of both national and personal rights, follows:

"PREAMBLE: We hold these truths to be, if not self-evident, then certainly based on that natural law which is the eternal Law of God as discovered by human reason.

that there exists an equality of rights among all nations, large or small, strong or weak, to life and independence, that nevertheless the origin of the human family requires that there be acknowledged an organic unity within which this equality of rights finds its expression and achieves its fulfillment.

that this organic unity of nations demands that the people be governed by a rule of law and not by the rule of force;

that this organic unity is broken up by the existence of nationisms bent on achieving its particular aims to the detriment of the common good;

that this organic unity is also disturbed by the doctrine of absolute and unlimited sovereignty which in the name of the will to live must never be tantamount to a death sentence for another" (Pius XII).

that a spirit of international responsibility of a hunger and thirst after justice, and a universal love must be the guiding forces of relations between nations.

that these things being so, all the peoples of the world enjoy the following rights:

I. The right of economic and political security in the lives, homes and means of decent livelihood of every person in the world.

II. The right to be delivered from the slavery of armaments which exist either to rob others of their rights or for defense against such robbery.

III. The right to demand an equitable and unanimous resolution of treaties which impair the equality of all nations.

IV. The right to remove by common action the consequences of imperialism, aggression, and the right of free access to raw materials and of free economic intercourse among all the peoples of the world without exception.

V. The right of denying to powerful aggregations of capital within the nations of an unlimited self-regulation of international economic activities not subject to any law.

VI. The right of the equal protection of law everywhere in the world for equitable treatment of laborers especially decent conditions of labor a living wage, reasonable hours, and the abolition of poverty of child labor and other economic inequalities.

VII. The right of small nations that the demands even legitimate, of larger nations yield before the claims of an organic order which respects the equality of all nations.

VIII. The right of all peoples to require, as a matter of international concern, that all associated nations respect the following individual rights:

the right of freedom of conscience and of worship before the State

the right of freedom of expression within the law.

the right of free association, of free assembly, and of free petition of grievances.

the right of private property; and of being secure against unlawful seizures and confiscations;

the right of freedom of education according to the wishes of the parent.

the right to be tried according to the law and to be secure against cruel and unusual punishments.

the right of ethnic and religious minorities to enjoy equal opportunities for the development of their common humanity.
