Hibernians Support Irish Neutrality

ST. PAUL—Resolutions supporting the neutrality stand of the Government of Ireland, calling upon both major political parties in the United States to adhere to their campaign promises to keep American soldiers out of the war, and pledging spiritual allegiance to the Pope were adopted at the sixty-second national convention of the Ancient Order of Hibernians in America, held at the Hotel New York in New York City, last night.

A highlight of the convention was a civic reception on Tuesday at which the speakers included: Most Rev. John Gregory Murray, Archbishop of St. Paul; Governor Stassen and Mayor McDonough.

Officers re-elected were: Joseph E. Kerrigan, Lawrence, Mass., president; Michael A. McGrath, Cleveland, vice-president; Peter Duce, Montreal, Canadian vice-president; Leo Kelly, Pittsburgh, secretary; John E. Fenton, Lawrence, Mass., president of the Junior Board, and Francis J. O'Brien, editor of the order's official publications.

In his sermon at the Pontifical Mass which opened the convention on Tuesday, more than 1,000 persons in St. Paul Cathedral heard the Rev. James A. Hyland, C.F.M., of Notre Dame parish, Chippewa Falls, Wis., sound the call to a vigorous defense of the Cross and of the flag. Reviewing the persecution of the Church in Ireland and the steadfastness of the nation in clinging to its faith, Father Hyland said the world honors the Irish "not because of their achievements in the fields of art and industry but because of their mystic character rooted in a total belief in God."

"God is to the Irish," he said, "a reality, a fact and a friend. The belief determines the whole direction of their living and the constancy of their patriotism, and must exercise a powerful influence in shaping the destiny of the world, and of America in particular."

Pointing to the embarrassment of pagan minds when the Irish Constitution was dedicated to the Most Blessed Trinity, Father Hyland outlined the triumph of the Cross throughout the world's history, and said that "in the battle of Calvary the ruling class won a quick victory only to be covered with eternal shame and failure."

Declaring that every page of America's history is a record of Irish patriotism and "every battlefield is a burial place of our gallant dead," Father Hyland said: "America, the last fortress of freedom, shall not fall. Not if we sink deep into our souls the conviction that a great peace effort is required and fling our hearts into the battle for God and country, then the cross and the flag will hold their honored places above the waters of the Pacific and the shores of the Atlantic. Business Leaders Spur Religious Training Move

WASHINGTON.—A striking illustration of the growing recognition of the necessity of moral and religious training as a part of the national public school system is afforded by an announcement of the Chamber of Commerce of the United States of a move to focus educational effort more directly upon current problems. A committee has been set up by the National Chamber to co-operate with a similar committee of the American Association of School Administrators in bringing about the establishment of local groups of business men and school officials to discuss educational matters and carry out the program.

The two committees, operating jointly, have outlined the objectives they have in mind as a starting point for the undertaking. Their declaration emphasizes the necessity of providing a better understanding of American traditions and institutions and the development of a religious background as one of the fundamentals to be considered in the education of our youth, among other things.

"The fundamental bases of American citizenship are political and religious freedom, therefore, understanding of the Bill of Rights, the Constitution and the fundamentals of our economy go hand in hand with an understanding of the Bible itself."

"There has been too little appreciation that an intelligent belief in God is the greatest asset that a child can have," the declaration states. "It is a sad commentary that in the United States some sixty-five million people have no religious faith. This is a definite challenge to the community. We must return to early fundamentals, i. e., each God-fearing family must see that its members clearly understand the tenets of the particular faith. While the responsibility is that of the family and the church, the schools must facilitate their work. A truly God-fearing nation is a strong nation."

In order that the schools may play an increasingly effective part in our complex life and that the work may be brought home to the community, it is proposed that local committees of business men and school administrators be organized to coordinate the present-day problems and needs of their respective communities. It is also proposed that a creed should be prepared in suitable language which will state what children might with propriety receive from their school training. This creed should be built around a belief in God and America and founded on a knowledge of the history of the servitude of the fundamentals of the Constitution, the Bill of Rights and our form of government and economy."

This statement is not the utterance of sentimentalists or theoreticians but rather, the declaration of practical business men and educators, as the membership of the two committees, which will cooperate in carrying out the program, indicates. It is a forthright recognition of the necessity of religious training in preparing the youth of the country for the responsibilities of American citizenship and the need to resist the encroachments of the pagan ideologies which are characteristic of dictatorial governments.

The statement may be taken as a reflection of the attitude of a majority of business men represented by the National Chamber, which might ordinarily be regarded as being more concerned with purely economic and political matters than the moral training of the youth of the country. It also reflects the belief that education if it is to be effective in meeting the grave problems which confront many peoples, including our own, cannot be wholly divorced from religious training.

Details of the program have, apparently, not been worked out. The joint committee of the Chamber of Commerce and the Association of School Administrators will probably act as a clearing house for similar local joint committees operating in each community.
