Exiled Nuns Open Novitiate On Island

MACAO, China.—The Missionary Sisters of Our Lady of Angels, who were forced by the war to leave Shanghai and Shensi have established themselves on the Island of Taipa, near here, and opened a novitiate. Lumen Service reports. At the first profession ceremony two Chinese Sisters made their first vows and two novitiates were admitted to the community, which now numbers nine professed Sisters, two postulants and two novitiates. Two other postulants are expected soon to enter the community.

Judge Asks Weekly Sermons For Prisoners

MACAO, China.—Testimony to the social value of religious instruction was given by a Judge of the Supreme Court at Shensi, Kwangtung, in this diocese, who sent a written request to the local missionary asking him to preach once a week in each of the two prisons to the end that "these malefactors and criminals may become more useful members of society." Burglars Loot Another Mexico City Church

MEXICO CITY.—The tabernacle in the Church of Our Lady of Guadalupe here in the Capital was broken open by burglars and the contents of the altar were looted. In addition to valuable vessels, the money for the poor-boxes and sanctuaries was stolen. The burglars are believed to be the same ones who broke into the Churches of Santa Maria Amalgaga and Los Remedios.

Church Robbed

MEXICO CITY.—The Church of La Santa Vera Cruz is the fourth within the Metropolitan jurisdiction to have been robbed in recent weeks. The door of the tabernacle was broken and a silver altar cloth removed. The poor-box was rifled and contributions made for vigil lights and candles were stolen.

San Jose, Costa Rica.—One of the principal thoroughfares in the Capital is to be named Avenida Monsenor Rafael Oton Castro y Jimenez in honor of the late Archbishop of San Jose, and in recognition of his "fecund spiritual work in behalf of the Christian Community of this Republic."

De Paul V. P. Dies

Denver.—The Rev. Thomas U. Powers, C.M., Vice-President of a Paul University, Chicago, for the last 17 years, died of a heart attack while on vacation at St. Thomas Seminary, here. He was 74 years old. Widely known as an orator and Shakespearean scholar, he was a native of Ireland and entered the Congregation of the Mission in 1908.
