Knights of Columbus Auriesville Pilgrimage Set

State Chaplain Pontificates Sun., Sept. 21. Pontifical Mass celebrated by His Excellency, Bishop Kearney, State Chaplain, at 12 noon will open the program of the Fourth Annual Pilgrimage to the Shrine of the North American Martyrs, Auriesville to be sponsored by New York State Council, Knights of Columbus and the Order of the Alhambra.

This year's pilgrimage is dedicated to the "Preservation of Our National Peace." Significance of the pilgrimage and religious services planned is told the members in a message from their State Chaplain, "The message states: 'My Dear Brother Knights: The critical times in which we find ourselves and the insistent appeals of our Holy Father urge us, as loyal Knights, to seize every opportunity of prayer and action to petition Almighty God to preserve our national peace, and in His own way, to restore peace to our stricken civilization. The Knights of Columbus will, once again, make a Peace Pilgrimage to the Shrine of the Martyrs at Auriesville. There we shall solicit the aid of these American Martyrs in our great act of faith and confidence in Divine assistance in our hour of national need. Again, the increasing number of our brothers in the service of their Country challenges us to insistent prayer to God to preserve them spiritually and physically until they reach the Heavenly City. The members in the various camps and branches of such time as they return to our service shall have special moments in our Mass at the shrine. I sincerely trust that our membership will be well represented at the Shrine of the Martyrs on the 21st of September. Praying God's blessing upon you and the members of your Council, James E. Kearney, D. D., BISHOP OF ROCHESTER.' The Knights of Columbus and the Order of the Alhambra invite their friends, men and women, to participate in the Pilgrimage starting 'all are welcome.' A special train out of Buffalo will leave Rochester at 7:08 A. M. (Daylight Saving Time) and Newark at 7:48 A. M. (DST) returning Auriesville at 3:30 p. m. and Newark at 6:15 p. m. Tickets are on sale at Rochester Consolidated Ticket Office, 34 Exchange St. and at the Newark Station Ticket Office. The Pilgrimage will take place regardless of their conditions.
